Grade 9 Math EQAO Update - February 25, 2021

For the 2020-21 school year, the EQAO is field testing a new online assessment for Grade 9 Academic and Applied mathematics courses. This assessment is intended to be administered to students taking a Grade 9 Mathematics course using an in-school instructional model near the end of the instructional period which would be the end of semester 2 (June 2021) for YRDSB secondary schools.

The York Region District School Board has decided that students in YRDSB secondary schools **will not** be participating in the Grade 9 Mathematics Assessment Field Test in June 2021.

The decision to not participate in the field test was made foremost in an effort to prioritize the well-being of students and support the continuity of learning in response to COVID-19.

Our current Adaptive rotation model of alternating in-class opportunities, near the end of the course, does not align with EQAO's Field Testing recommendations. Lastly, the current model of student attendance limits the flexibility of extending the instruction period to allow for extra time.

Application

Each year, TRREB grants \$15,000 to four graduating high school students pursuing post-secondary education, including two \$5,000 first-place and two \$2,500 second-place scholarships.

To qualify, students must demonstrate academic achievement, leadership skills and community involvement, plus, write a 1,500-word (minimum) essay on one of two timely topics. This year's topics focus on the dream of home ownership and impact of a growing population on housing in the GTA.
