

As suggested by the *Premier's Highly Skilled Workforce Expert Panel Report*, the program will support students to begin planning their future career path by helping them better understand the world of work.

On **Wednesday, November 2, 2022,** Grade 9 students will have an opportunity to spend the day at a workplace of a parent/guardian, relative, friend or volunteer. There is a <u>Family Guide Resource</u> available to support families with planning.

Please be advised that permission forms to participate in Take Our Kids to Work Day are available on School Cash Online. We ask that you review the permission form with your child and then sign off as per the instructions by logging into your School Cash Online account. If you do not have a School Cash Online account, you can create one by visiting YRDSB/Schoolcashonline.com. Please submit the permission forms on or before Monday October 31, 2022.

Parents/Guardians can also choose to have their child participate independently in career exploration activities at home or at school. Please indicate this choice on the permission form so that schools can plan appropriately. Students who choose to attend school on this day will be supervised as they work through the virtual career exploration modules that will be available for them to do independently. Students will be able to access the Independent Career Exploration resources through the Mulock Guidance Google Classroom.




