Teachers Report – Samantha Pohlmann

- \$980.00 was raised through fundraising in December and March
- The School Council can determine how the money can be spent
- There must be a plan to determine how the money must be spent
- Kelly proposed using the funds towards and outdoor classroom
- Carmen has additional money in the budget that can be put towards this plan
- She has spoken to the Eco Club advisor
- Carmen would like student voice involved in the planning
- We could look at a longer fundraising plan but it cannot be too long as students and their family would want to be able to see what we are working on
- An outdoor space may help with COVID
- The money needs to be spent in a reasonable time frame
- Could consider grants and apply for a project
- We cannot access money through sponsorship
- Someone can donate money but they cannot ask for recognition in return
- This discussion will be continued after the questions from parents are addressed as there have been questions about whether or not money can be spent towards the 2020 graduates

Administrators Report - Carmen

- Teachers are trying to deliver programs moving forward there will be more synchronized learning opportunities
- They are developing a Learning and Caring 2.0 plan
- We need to consider barriers to on line learning for some youth for example they might be responsible for carrying for siblings or they may have to share laptops with their siblings
- Enrolment is up for 2020/2021
- They will have a good compliment of teachers

- Some teachers are leaving for opportunities at other schools and we will be getting some new teachers
- They are currently working through course conflicts right now

Will there be a plan for students to access any items left in their lockers? Also, how can students access IT support remotely if something happens to their school laptop?	 Access to school is June 15-17. Anyone who hasn't yet signed up can attend the school on June 15 and we can accommodate them If there are issues with school laptop "loaners", board loaners or SEA equipment please contact VP/P and we will contact ITS Typically our ITS department is dropping off another laptop and taking the other one back for service

If the kids were in school the class would be going Example it is now 8:55 and first period math is not available	 Learning and Caring Plan developed by board, as per Ministry direction Teachers were given direction to provide 3 hours per week per subject Asynchronous model to begin; teachers had choice re synchronous Ministry and Board mandated synchronous to be implemented in June. Teachers providing 1-2 opportunities per week for the Month of June (Not mentioned in meeting, but additional information) There was no mandate around what time of day materials were to be posted, only that office hours are to be shared with students so they could expect teacher response immediately within that hour

Learning and Caring plan 2.0 is being developed but awaiting Ministry direction We anticipate that synchronous learning (where students can see their teachers) will be part of this plan We recognize the importance of "face to face" engagement

We expect some in-person classes We also expect some online presence to start the year. We anticipate video conferencing (synchronous learning) with students

Please share information on what the September back to school format is anticipated to be. What is the % live classroom attendance to online learning? Will students be required to wear face masks in school? Will hand sanitizer be provided in the schools? If not , any possibility that students have video conferences classes? Is it possible some courses be online, some attending at school?	 We are awaiting Ministry direction to YRDSB about the plan. There will also be a plan should we need to close the schools due to Public Health directives

Realizing there are no definitive decisions as of yet, could the various options under consideration for "the back to school plan" in September be reviewed with parents.	 Carmen consulted with Superintendent on this question It has not yet been 100% determined what parent outreach will look like However, current feedback via parent survey is being closely analysed and being used to inform updated board plan (Learning & Caring Plan 2.0)
