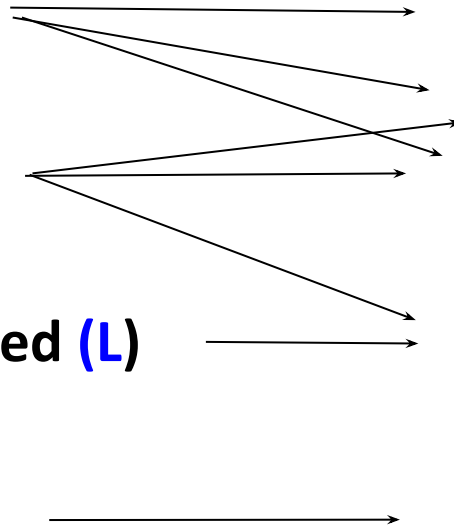

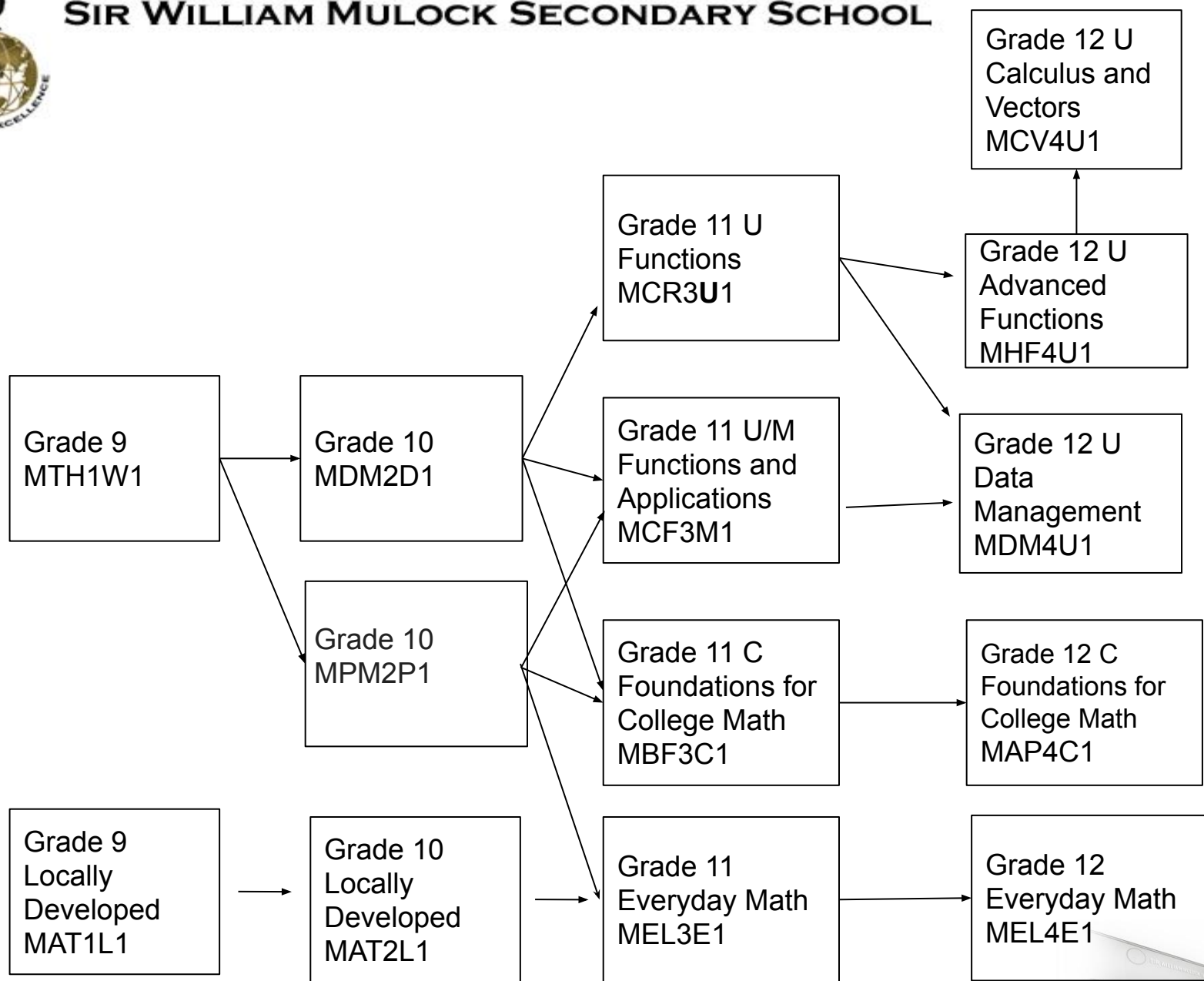

# Online Courses



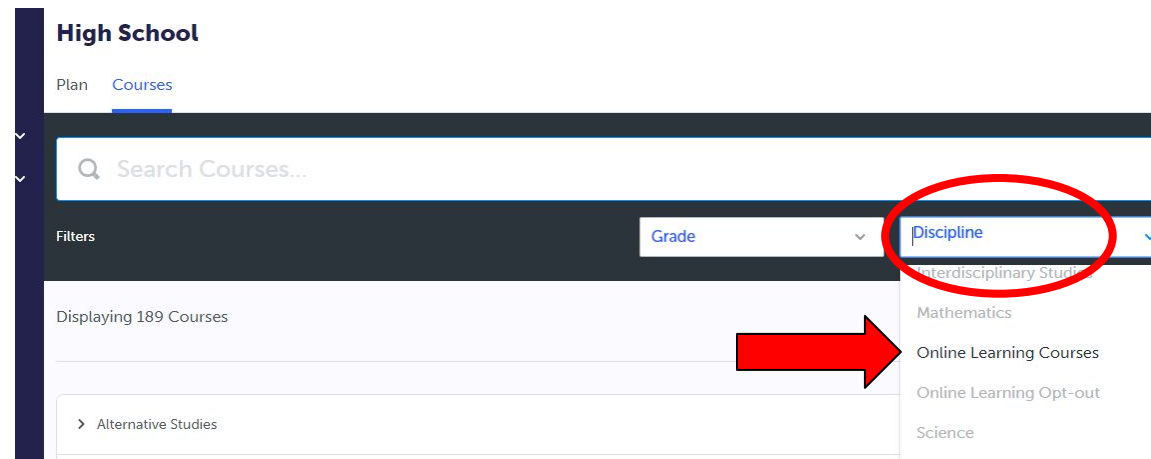
- A graduation requirement

- Online Options: Day School online (DSoL) or Summer School online (SSoL)
- Online courses are asynchronous

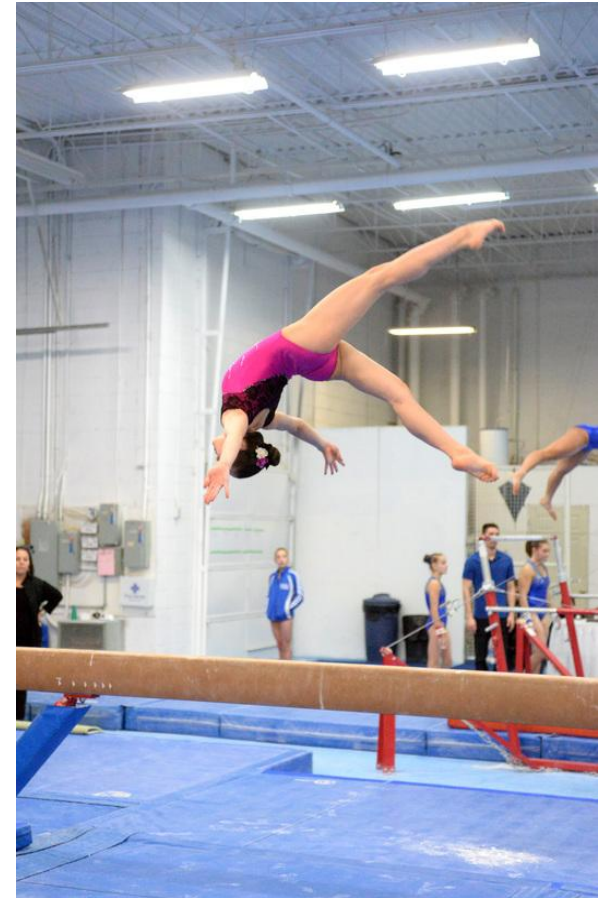

# High Performance Athlete (HPA)

- Allows students who compete at the **provincial, national, or international** level in a particular sport to earn cooperative education credits through their training
- Must be training a minimum of **15** hours per week
- Speak with Guidance if you think you qualify





# Co-operative Education

- Allows interested students the opportunity to earn credits through experiential learning in a workplace setting
- half-day (2 credit) or full-day (4 credit)

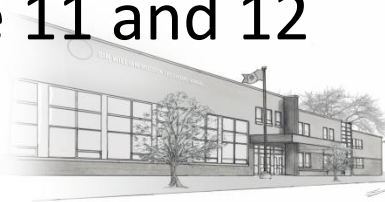

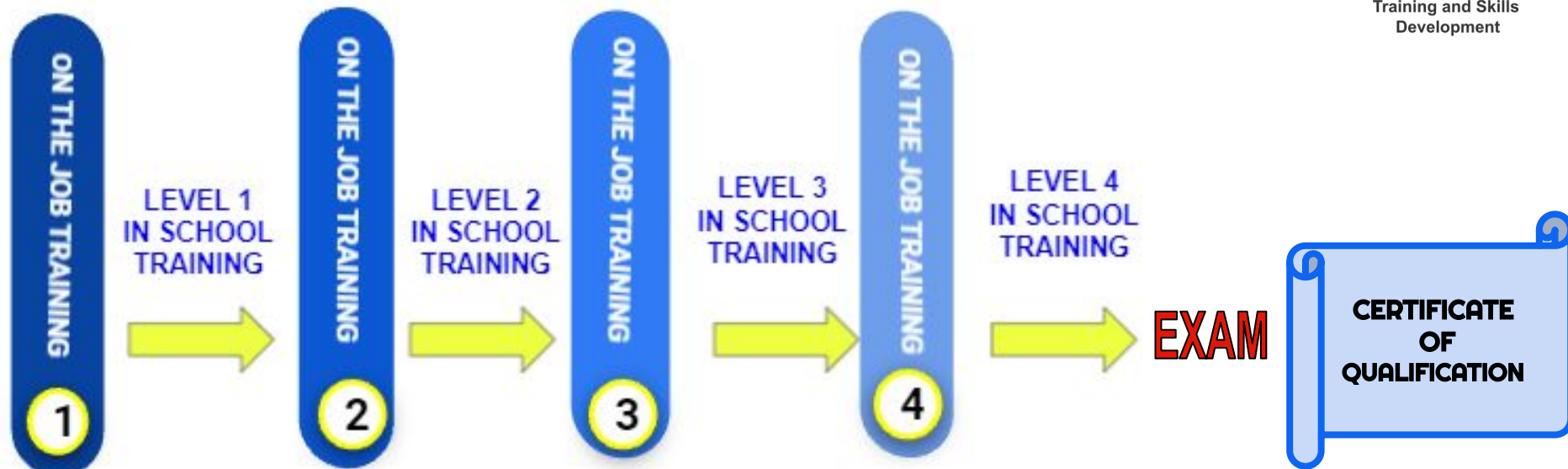

    - Degree programs require 6 Grade 12 U/M courses as prerequisites (Seneca-3 year Degree programs with college level pre-requisites)

## College Admission Requirements

Ontario colleges require students to graduate from high school and most require grade 12 English. Either grade 12 college (C) or university (U) English are acceptable. Additional prerequisites in math and/or science are required for most engineering, science, health care, business, computer and math related programs. Many colleges require students to complete a standardized admissions test and use a combination of marks in prerequisite courses and the results of the admissions testing to determine admissions. College degree programs require students to have 6 grade 12 courses at the university (U) or university/college (M) courses. Specific admission requirements can be found at [www.ontariocolleges.ca](http://www.ontariocolleges.ca)

### Consider College if you:

- enjoy combining theoretical and technical knowledge
- want practical industry-related learning
- have a specific career goal / focus
- may wish to enter the workforce quickly
- benefit from a more intimate learning environment

## University Admission Requirements

All Ontario universities require students to graduate from high school with 6 grade 12 university (U) or university/college (M) courses with a minimum average of 70% (although many schools require significantly higher admissions averages). Most programs require grade 12U English as a prerequisite. Additional prerequisites in math and/or science are required for most engineering, science, health care, business, computer and math related programs. - Ask guidance to make sure your activity is eligible & get it pre-approved

# Literacy Requirement



- OSSLT Most of you wrote on November 27, 2024
- Results will come in January 2024
- If you are unsuccessful, you may rewrite the literacy test in April 2025 or complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC401)





# Summer School Reminders

- runs in July
- **Reinforcement** – 2 weeks - for students who were unsuccessful, and are approved by the credit recovery team
- **Acceleration** – 4 weeks - for students who have never taken the course before, or who were unsuccessful but did not meet the criteria for credit recovery
- Sign up starting in **April**
