Grade 12 Course Selection

- Students are not allowed to be part-time (must take at least 3 courses in a semester)
- Choose at least 6 courses next year + 2 alternatives (may want to pick 8+2; it's easier to drop a course than pick up one)
- No spares unless 24 credits achieved
- Be aware that many Grade 12 courses have prerequisites. Use **PATHWAY** to plan ahead
- Submit by February 21, 2025





34 Credit Threshold

- Most students will complete 30 credits in 4 years
- If needed, students may earn up to 34 credits within 5 years
- After secondary school, going beyond the 34 credit threshold is possible with e-learning, night school, summer school, adult day school, etc.
- Repeated courses count twice towards the threshold
- 34 credit threshold does not apply...
 - if you have an Individual Education Plan (IEP)
 - to English as a Second Language (ESL) language courses
 - in the first four years of secondary school

Online Courses



- A graduation requirement

- Online courses are asynchronous




Pathways to Apprenticeship

during high school	ΟΥΑΡ	 grade 11 or 12 - full day or half day co-op may accumulate apprenticeship hours potential to continue after graduation
	accelerated OYAP	 grade 12 semester 2 full day co-op & 8-12 week Level 1 in-class training may accumulate apprenticeship hours potential to continue after graduation
after high	sponsor	• find an employer to take you on after graduation
school	union	 apply directly to the union - they connect you with employer and will enrol you in training approximately \$500 membership fee, \$40/month union fees pension, benefits, security
	college	 Trades Fundamentals programs (2-3 semesters) - If unsure of trade that best suits you

90%: on-the-job training

3000 - 9000 Hours and/or Skill Competencies

10%: in the classroom training

- You can complete a:
 - Certificate (1 year)
 - Diploma (2 years)


- College Admissions <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>
 - High school diploma (OSSD)
 - Need grade 12 College English for most programs
 - Minimum 70% average usually; many programs higher
 - GENERALLY NO DIFFERENCE RECOGNIZED BETWEEN COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY COURSES
 - Degree programs require 6 Grade 12 U/M courses as prerequisites (Seneca-3 year Degree programs with college level pre-requisites)
 - Supplementary information





Consider college if you:

- enjoy combining theoretical and technical knowledge
- want practical industry-related learning
- have a specific career goal / focus
- Wish to enter the workforce quickly
- would benefit from a more intimate learning environment







Post Secondary Planning

- University Admissions
 - Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences
 - 12 U English; 5 other 12 U / M courses
 - Pure & Applied Sciences, Engineering
 - 12 U English; 12 U Advanced Functions; 12 U Calculus & Vectors; 12 U Biology, Chemistry, Physics (at least 2); 1 other 12 U / M course
 - Business & Commerce
 - 12 U English; 12 U Math (at least 1, often 2); 4 other U / M credits (business recommended)
 - Fine & Performing Arts
 - 12 U English; 5 other U / M credits; audition/portfolio


- minimum 70% average; many programs much higher
- some programs require as many as 5 specific U courses as prerequisites
- Supplementary information





Consider university if you:

- are self motivated
- are an independent learner
- have good time management skills
- have good communication skills
 - both written and oral
- are teamwork oriented
- are analytical





Community Involvement



- 40 hours needed to graduate
- Get it done before grade 12 starts



- Come to Guidance to make sure your activity is eligible & get it pre-approved
- Opportunities available in the Guidance Google Classroom, mulock.ss.yrdsb.ca & Weekly e-bulletin





Summer School Reminders

- runs in July
- Reinforcement 2 weeks for students who were unsuccessful, and are approved by the credit recovery team
- Acceleration 4 weeks for students who have never taken the course before, or who were unsuccessful but did not meet the criteria for credit recovery
- Sign up starting in April
