

- DEADLINE: FRIDAY FEBRUARY 21, 2025 @ 4pm














Course Selection (Not-Returning)


Students <u>MUST</u> still go on to




 You will need to give a reason why you are not returning. There will be options to select.

Course Selection (Returning/Unsure)

- If you are unsure, choose courses for next year
- My Pathway Planner does NOT limit you to 34 credits, but if you choose more than 34 credits, guidance will be reviewing your course selection in the spring and will contact you to reduce your course choices
 - Submit by <u>February 21, 2025</u>






34 Credit Threshold

- Most students will complete 30 credits in 4 years
- If needed, students may earn up to 34 credits within 5 years
- After secondary school, going beyond the 34 credit threshold is possible with e-learning, night school, summer school, adult day school, etc.
- Repeated courses count twice towards the threshold
- 34 credit threshold does not apply...
 - if you have an Individual Education Plan (IEP)
 - to English as a Second Language (ESL) language courses
 - in the first four years of secondary school







Dual Credit

www.yrdsb.ca/dualcredits

- Allows interested students the opportunity to attend college while still in high school
- The cost of tuition, transportation, and books are covered by the government
- Students will earn both a college credit and an associated high school credit
- MUST have period 5 off or PM co-op/alt ed for travel time
- Course are often offered in the afternoon ex/3:20 – 6pm one day a week

Graduation Ceremony

- ONLY students who have completed their diploma requirements will be invited to participate in the graduation ceremony (Thursday June 26th)
- students who will finish in June with 29 completed credits and plan to take their final credit in summer school can request to participate in the graduation ceremony by making an appointment with their guidance counselor
- students MUST have completed, 40 hours of community involvement, on-line (or opt out) and literacy, unless the literacy course is their final summer school credit

What to Expect After You've Applied

- Confirmation email
- Email with post-secondary student number and login instructions for a new account with the school to which you applied
- Check the portals for each institution regularly
- Check OUAC/OCAS regularly for offers
- Residence deadlines and program deadlines may differ
- Be aware of fee deadlines
- Course selection will happen in late spring early summer



OSAP

- OSAP application is open and can be completed with your college / university application
- ALL students should apply for OSAP
- Click <u>OSAP</u> to apply, and transfer your demographic information to the OSAP site
