- LOCK IN BEGINS: **THURSDAY FEBRUARY 16, 2023 @ 9am**
- DEADLINE: **FRIDAY FEBRUARY 24, 2023 @ 4pm**





Grade 12 Course Selection

- Students are not allowed to be part-time
(must take at least 3 courses in a semester)
- Choose at least 6 courses next year + 2 alternatives
(may want to pick 8+2; it's easier to drop a course than pick up one)
- No spares unless 24 credits achieved
- Be aware that many Grade 12 courses have prerequisites. Use  to plan ahead
- Submit by **February 24**





34 Credit Threshold

- Most students will complete 30 credits in 4 years
- If needed, students may earn up to 34 credits within 5 years
- After secondary school, going beyond the 34 credit threshold is possible with e-learning, night school, summer school, adult day school, etc.
- Repeated courses count twice towards the threshold
- 34 credit threshold does not apply...
 - if you have an Individual Education Plan (IEP)
 - to English as a Second Language (ESL) language courses
 - in the first four years of secondary school

Dual Credit

- Allows interested students the opportunity to attend college while still in high school
- The cost of tuition, transportation, and books are covered by the government
- Students will earn both a college credit and an associated high school credit
- MUST have last period off or PM co-op/alt ed for travel time
- Course are often offered in the afternoon
ex/ 3:20 – 6pm one day a week



- High school diploma (OSSD)
 - Need grade 12 college English
 - Some require grade 12 college math & grade 12 college physics
 - **GENERALLY NO DIFFERENCE RECOGNIZED BETWEEN COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY COURSES**
- Some apprenticeships require college first
- For those not requiring college:
 - ➡ Accelerated OYAP placement - continue apprenticeship with employer
 - or ➡ OYAP placement - continue apprenticeship with employer
 - or ➡ Find an employer to take you on as apprentice
 - or ➡ Attend College - learn about your trade, make connections to find employer to take you on as an apprentice






The Apprenticeship Pathway

 - Minimum 70% average usually; many programs higher
 - **GENERALLY NO DIFFERENCE RECOGNIZED BETWEEN COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY COURSES**
 - Degree programs require 6 Grade 12 U/M courses as prerequisites

- May wish to enter the workforce quickly
- Benefits from a more intimate learning environment

- **University Admissions**

- Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences

- 12 U English; 5 other 12 U / M courses

- Pure & Applied Sciences, Engineering

- 12 U English; 12 U Advanced Functions; 12 U Calculus & Vectors; 12 U Biology, Chemistry, Physics (at least 2); 1 other 12 U / M course

- Business & Commerce

- 12 U English; 12 U Math (at least 1, often 2); 4 other U / M credits (business recommended)

- Fine & Performing Arts

- 12 U English; 5 other U / M credits; audition/portfolio

- High school diploma (OSSD)
- 6 grade 12 U or M courses
 - minimum 70% average; many programs much higher
 - some programs require as many as 5 specific U courses as prerequisites

- self motivated
- an independent learner
- teamwork oriented
- analytical

- 40 hours needed to graduate
changes for this year only
 - up to **10 hours** for **paid employment**
 - hours for “duties normally performed in the home”
- Try to get it done before grade 12 starts
- Come to Guidance to make sure your activity is eligible & get it pre-approved

Summer School Reminders

- Reinforcement – 2 weeks - for students who were unsuccessful, and are approved by the credit recovery team
- Acceleration – 4 weeks - for students who have never taken the course before, or who were unsuccessful but did not meet the criteria for credit recovery
- Sign up starting in April
