Questions to ask representatives at Post Secondary Fairs

- 1. What are the prerequisite courses required for my program of interest?
- 2. What is the projected cut-off average for my program of interest?
- 3. Are there any additional admission requirements besides marks?
 ✓ many programs require student profiles, interviews, portfolios, auditions etc.
- 4. For university programs, do you use top 6 grade 12 U / M marks including prerequisites or just top 6 grade 12 U / M marks?
- 5. Is there admissions testing required for my program of interest?
 ✓ many colleges use a combination of admissions testing & high school marks
- 6. How big is the program (how many students are admitted)? How big will my classes be?
- 7. Is residence guaranteed for first-year students?
- 8. What entrance scholarships are offered? How do I apply for them?
- 9. What marks are used to determine my entrance scholarship?
 ✓ if you use semester 2 midterm marks, can my scholarship change based on final marks?
- 10. If a course is "recommended" to get into a program, what does this really mean?
- 11. Is there a language test/requirement needed to get into the program?
- 12. What kinds of jobs are graduates of this program entering?
- 13. What percent of graduates of this program find employment in their field?
- 14. Is there a co-op option or work placement experience for this program?
- 15. Does the school give alternate offers if I don't get into my 1st choice of program?
- 16. Is the order that I choose my programs on my application important?
- 17. What is the earliest date that I might have to pay a deposit?
- 18. When is the latest date that I will hear back about an offer?
