NMPS Literacy

Reading is more than sounding out the words. Understanding what is read involves making connections between print and the reader's experiences. Good readers use a variety of strategies to make meaning from print. Sounding out words may be difficult for some readers.

Throughout the year, students will engage in reading fiction and non-fiction materials where inferencing skills are practiced and reinforced. Children are asked to explain both explicit and implicit understanding of what they've read. Inferencing can be a challenging reading strategy to master. As you read with your child at home, have discussions about hidden information as well as make realistic predictions to help build your child's inferring skills.

NMPS Mathematics

Instruction in mathematics must emphasize conceptual understanding and not just procedural knowledge. Students who are assigned activities that emphasize only the rote acquisition of procedures (procedural knowledge) without promoting an active understanding of the concepts underlying such procedures are at a disadvantage, especially in the later grades, when they encounter more abstract concepts. If mathematics becomes nothing but procedures, students attain only a superficial understanding one that, over time, may disappear completely.


All parents are welcome to our next School Council Meetings scheduled for Wednesday, February 29th and Monday, March 26th at 6:30 p.m. in the library.

Help your children with their abc123s using online videos

Every day at school, your children learn important skills. As a parent, you can help develop and strengthen those skills by encouraging your children to apply what they've learned in the classroom to regular activities at home and in the community.

Pointing out words on signs or buildings helps children practice their reading and learn new words. A trip to the grocery store provides a great opportunity for a math and vocabulary lesson. Your refrigerator can act as a central learning zone where you post puzzles or games.

To complement these activities, a series of video podcasts is now available online at **ontario.ca/abc123**. These videos will help you identify lots of ways to support and develop your child's reading, writing and math skills. They are aimed at parents of children from preschool through Grade 6, and feature real families just like yours, learning together through everyday activities.

New videos will be posted every month and are available in English and in French.

All you need to watch the video podcasts is a computer with a media player, such as Windows Media. You can watch the videos online on the abc123 website, or download them to your computer for future viewing. You can even put them on a mobile device, like an iPod, with video capabilities and watch them on the go!
