## Adminstrator's Message

It is with great excitement that we begin the inaugural 2011-2012 school year at Nellie McClung P.S. We hope that everyone has had a relaxing summer break and are focused on the many exciting learning opportunities that the new school year will bring. A special thank you to the caretaking staff, office staff and teaching staff for the many additional hours they put into preparing for a successful September start-up.

We are certainly privileged to be named after Nellie McClung one of the Famous Five who fought for women to get the right to vote in Canada. It was Ms. McClung's early work and dedication as a women's rights leader that has laid the foundation for equitable and inclusionary practices in Canada. Ms. McClung was indeed a woman of character who became involved in social reform challenging social problems facing women and children from different backgrounds. Character education will be the foundation on which we base many of the initiatives that we embrace at our school. Initiatives such as Restorative Practices and Tribes as well as our commitment to the environment are just a few examples of how we will blend academic excellence with good citizenship.

As you are aware, each year schools are organized following very stringent parameters for class size and enrolment, particularly in the primary grades. In grades JK to 3 there is a cap of 20 students per class (with the exception of Full Day Early Learning Programs and 23 for new schools). In all schools this necessitates the creation of several split grade classrooms throughout all divisions. As we process new registrations and determine those students who have moved away, our organization may shift in order to maintain the Ministry requirements. During the next week and a half we will meet as a staff to discuss any reorganization that may need to occur. Parents will be informed during the week of September 26th about any changes that will occur that may or may not impact their child. Changes to student placements will not be reviewed before this date.

In closing, we would like to remind you that we can not be successful in our mission to "inspire and prepare learners for life in our changing world community" without YOU! We welcome your participation in your child's learning and look forward to partnering with you to ensure that every student is a literate graduate prepared to embrace all that life has to offer. We look forward to working with you throughout the coming year.

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## Kindergarten Q & A

Can I come into the fenced in area to drop off my JK child?

Now that routines have begun, it is expected that all JK and SK students say their good-byes at their designated gates. Staff will assist your child. This will reduce congestion and aid in our focus on students and their safe entry.

What can parents do to get more toys and equipment for the Kindergarten students?

As a new school, we are still receiving and unpacking supplies for our students. We were fortunate to have games painted on our pavement as well as having access to the field as this is not usually the case with new schools. We ask that you be patient.

When I ask my child what he /she did at school he/she said he played. Will my child be ready for grade one and what is he/she learning?

As discussed at the Kindergarten Orientation in May 2011, your child will participate in a play-based learning program. ## **Transportation**

Students in **Grades JK-3** must live more than 1.2 km. from the school to qualify for bussing.

## School Organization

We have organized classrooms based on the most recent enrolment and following Ministry/ Board regulations and guidelines. There may be further changes in the next few weeks depending on actual numbers of students in the building. We will keep you informed as we move ahead.

#### A word about combined classes:

Your children are in combined classes. This is a result of there being a cumbersome number of students at particular grade levels. Sometimes, there are too many students to form one class, but not enough students to form two classes. In these situations, students from two different grade levels are grouped together to form a combined class.

Educational literature shows that children in combined grade groupings function at a level that is comparable to children in a straight grade. Student achievement is not compromised. In addition, the research suggests that multi-age grouping is associated with a more positive self-concept and an enhanced attitude towards learning.

When we consider students for a combined class, the following criteria is considered:

- a balance according to gender
- work habits, maturity, co-operation
- a balance of ability, interests, and talents
- social or behavioral considerations
- ESL or Special Education needs
- Learning styles of the students

The placement of your child in the higher grade of a split class does not mean that your child has not met curriculum requirements. If your child is in the lower grade, they are not necessarily ahead of their peers in a straight grade.

Educational research supports many benefits for students in combined classes, including:

- the development of independent learning skills
- students learn from each other
- the enhancement of social/emotional development
- leadership opportunities for students

### **Allergies**

There are children and staff who have life threatening allergies. In order to ensure the health and wellbeing of these individuals, we have a **Scent and Peanut/Nut Sensitive Policy in our school.** We need the understanding and commitment of everyone in our community. **Please take the time to read ingredient labels carefully.** This will help to ensure that our students, staff and visitors remain free from exposure to nut products, perfumes and scented sprays and help avoid the possibility of a medical emergency.

### **Equity Alert!**

Due to students with extreme food allergies and in fostering an equitable learning environment, no food products for birthdays as well as fast food purchases for lunch (i.e., McDonald's etc.) will be allowed into the school. Thank you for your cooperation and efforts at inspiring healthy eating habits for our children.
