It is with great excitement that we begin the 2012-13 school year at Nellie McClung P.S. We hope that everyone has had a relaxing summer break and are focused on the many exciting learning opportunities that the new school year will bring. A special thank you to the caretaking staff, office staff and teaching staff for the many additional hours they put into preparing for a successful September start-up.

In grades JK to 3 there is a cap of 20 students per class (with the exception of Full Day Early Learning Programs). In all schools this may necessitate the creation of several combined (split) grade classrooms throughout all divisions. As we process new registrations and determine those students who have moved away, our organization may shift in order to maintain the Ministry requirements. During the next week and a half we will meet as a staff to discuss any reorganization that may need to occur. Parents will be informed during the week of September 24th about any changes that will occur that may or may not impact their child. Changes to student placements will not be reviewed before this date.

Please mark your calendars for **Kindergarten Curriculum night on Monday**, **Sept. 24th.** Parents and students can begin entering the school at 6:30 pm and proceed directly to their child's class. The evening will wrap up by 7:30 pm. Teachers will answer questions around programming—this will not be the time to discuss individual students. Information about Curriculum Night for Grades 1 to 8 is being planned for October 10th.

In closing, we would like to remind you that we can not be successful in our mission to "inspire and prepare learners for life in our changing world community" without YOU! We welcome your participation in your child's learning and look forward to partnering with you to ensure that every student is a literate graduate prepared to embrace all that life has to offer. Medication

Thank you to all parents who have promptly returned medical forms and medication for your child/ren. The Board policy states that those students who require an Epi Pen MUST carry their Epi Pen on them in a "fanny pack" at all times during the day. This also includes on the bus coming to school and going home. It is mandatory that the school office has an extra Epi—Pen that is kept in the health room. Parents are asked to bring the extra Epi-Pen to school as soon as possible along with the required medical forms completely filled out.


Important Information for Parent Volunteers

Due to students with extreme food allergies and in fostering an equitable learning environment, no food products for birthdays as well as fast food purchases for lunch (i.e., McDonald's etc.) will be allowed into the school. must live more



than 1.2 km. from the school to qualify for bussing.

Students in Grades 4 - 8 must live more than 1.6 km. from the school to qualify for bussing.

This means that a student may have qualified in grade 3 but no longer qualifies in grade 4. It also means that one sibling may qualify and the other may not.
