Opening

- Mike to chair
- Announces birth of Maria's baby

Preliminary Matters

- Approval of November 6, 2014 Minutes
 - Motion by Darren to approve, second by Rob
 - All in favour, motion passes

Principal's Report

- Bar and Bat Mitzvah Book
 - Parent approached Wendy and suggested
 - Wendy decided not to do it
 - Spoke with principal that started tradition at other school; Wendy thinks that people can do that through Facebook, which was not available when they started tradition at the other school
- French Immersion Registration
 - New school in Block 18
 - To register need to come into office and get office card; if current SK student, need office index card from current school; must also bring proof of residence or ID
 - Our students would register at Ventura because school not built yet
 - Going to open September 2015; south of Major Mackenzie west of Dufferin
- School Climate Survey
 - Results shared; every 2 years occurs; 87 parent responses for over
 700 students last year; this survey was done in May last year
 - This info might not be valid because all responses might come from Anne Frank parents
 - #5. Unsatisfied with steps against bullying among students; 68% strongly agree; work to be done
 - o #6: 68% agree consequences for student behavior
 - #8: school action against discrimination or bullying; 60% agree
 - o Review of other questions and results; 12, 13, 14
 - This will not be posted anywhere or published
 - Equity survey done with staff gave valuable information
- Draft School Improvement Plan
 - Data gathered from variety of sources
 - Need to make sure there is congruence between needs, goals and actions
 - Example, climate survey showed that cyber bullying was not a rampant problem, thus concerted or immediate actions not required
 - Came up with global goals; created challenge of practice
 - Urgent learning need: students are challenged to respond with sufficient relevant detail to share their thinking; teachers goal:

- facilitate model discussions while modeling for students how to use talk to give relevant detail to share their thinking
- Oral language is a focus, through math or literacy activities
- Doing think aloud strategies explicitly with students
- Actions literacy:
 - Ensure regular reading in programs, rich talk, thinking through routines, power writing (graphic organizers), talk partners, modeled and shared part of gradual release, etc.
- Action Math:
 - Fosnot kit helps with 3 part math lessons to break down problems and understanding why
 - Teaching teachers and students to use manipulatives
 - Participating in math part 1 and maybe 2 AQ (additional qualifications) – Board in process of writing standards – Wendy will invite staff to part icipate in AQs after finalized
 - Use prodigy math, (not school-wide yet); demo-ing dreambox in Grades 4/5 and 5/6
- Monitored actions and effect; report card and EQAO data presented where improvement needed
 - Over 20% of students at risk in math and literacy
 - Will be done again in February and June to monitor
 - We are at 75% in primary math, but only 53% in junior math; lot of work to do
- As council, fundraising helps, but volunteerism helps
- Darren suggested that Teachme app is very effective and helpful for home use, whole app bundle costs \$8.00
- Environment, Engagement, and Well-Being
 - Social skills groups
 - Will start a positive space room (PSR), board and card games, no tech, drawing, playdough, blocks, etc.
 - Safe environment for kids to go when they feel lonely
 - Students selected by staff, parents may ask their teacher about their child's inclusion
- Equity and Inclusivity
 - Youth facilitators, peer mentoring
 - Lunchroom monitors
 - School wide tribes
 - Recognition assemblies
 - In process of meeting with community liaison officer to hopefully set up 10-12 week pre-school program to help get pre-schoolers ready for school between January and June (space to do it now); Seneca is agency bringing in ECE to facilitate this
- This is public and will appear on school website
- This SIP format just changed (used to use smart goals)
- Work to be done yet; still to be presented to teachers, although it has been shared with them
- Invited questions

- Neil suggested making a night like math night to introduce this info
 - Response is lack of attendance
 - Wendy suggests perhaps a video conference or presentation

- Cookie sale grade 8 fundraiser, next coming up next week Wed to Fri;
 leadership opportunity; count money, manage process; sold at lunch recess
- Mrs. Kurtz grade 7 went to Holocaust education centre; she wrote email because council funded the bus portion of that; moving and information trip to Centre; watched video, saw artifacts, group discussion, survivor shared experiences, post-trip discussions; thank you; powerful experience for all
- Chance to participate in spoken word poetry this year; incorporates rap, hip hop, theatre; grades 6 to 8 Ms. Gordon Rack doing intro work; next Tuesday can take 15 kids for after school training; will select 4-5 students for Poetry Slam team at YRDSB
