What we are Learning

In Reading, we are learning to pick "Just Right" books and we are working on building our reading stamina (length of time we can read (or look at books independently). We will also learn a variety of decoding strategies based on our current reading readiness. Some of us will be learning to recognize high-frequency words (such as: the, and, like, me) and are working on matching what we say with the words on the page. Others will learn to use letter-sound information along with the meaning of the story to figure out unfamiliar words. Another word solving strategy our class will be learning is how to'chunk' a word by breaking it up into little parts to say rather than trying to sound out individual letters in the word. For some of the students the focus will be on, reading stories smoothly and with fluency. We also try to find smaller words in bigger words and root words. For example, we see the root word 'look' in the bigger word 'looking'. Students now have access to t he website http://www.raz-kids.com/ where there are many online leveled

books.

In $\ensuremath{Writing}$, we will be working on procedure writing for a variety of audiences while continuing to work on writing good sentences. We have learned that good sentences:

- start with a capital letter
- end with punctuation (a period for telling sentences, an exclamation mark for surprising sentences and a question mark for question sentences)
- make sense and express a complete thought Students will then begin to write in their writers' notebooks while building their writing stamina.

In Math, we will be working on the data management and probability strand. Students will collect data and organize it into graphs and pictographs

In Social Studies, we will be exploring the following

inquiry questions: Why is it important to respect others? How do we show respect for others? How do people's various roles and responsibilities help shape who they are? How is your role as a friend different from your role as a son or brother/sister or daughter?
