- 3. Student Council Report Carson Pennington
 - Carson is the new student VP
 - Successful semi-formal sold out
 - Student activity day
 - Vacai day with vacation apparel
 - Reduction in Spirit day participation Carson suggests earlier notice
 - Next Spirit day = identity theft day take on the identity of a teacher or student
 - Socks and sandals day

 - Carnival being planned

4. Staff Reports

- a. SHSM & Co-operative Education Candace Smith & Laurie Johnson
 - -presented a slide show of the co-op opportunity in the community to earn up to 4 credits
 - -rich and robust opportunities at NHS and in Newmarket
 - -associated with Superior Court of Justice, York Region in IT Department, OSPCA, YRDSB (5 students in elementary schools as TAs) and Town of Gwillimbury (1 student in Fire Department with a very successful result)
 - -Laurie and Candice explained the participation of many of the students shown in the slide show and established that the co-op was rigorous and learning directed
 - -SHSM = Specialist High Skills Major program allows students to acquire a specialty training certificate
 - -Sport was a former program which will be moved into Health and Wellness

- -The Government provides funds for this training the students expenses are paid for by the SHSM program
- -some post-secondary schools are recognizing these courses and certifications
- -students are advised which courses are required for the students to complete the program and are guided by Candice and Laurie
- -there is online detailed information and calendars of events
- -the available certifications are set out on the website
- -the students are provided with appropriate garments for their programs and swag identification apparel
- -partners include McMaster, Georgian, Seneca. Southlake, Town of Newmarket Candice referred the council to the online calendar
- -the program is growing and had 32 students last year and has increased to 78 next year
- -many students are being offered jobs
- -much of the program's work is to establish partners suitable for the students
- -the parents were asked to participate if they can take students in their businesses
- -there are at least 4 visits to each partner to monitor the student's progress
- -SHSM program has existed for about 10 years
- -Co-op is available only for grade 11 and 12 and the applications are being done online at this time
- -SHSM is available if a student has or will take co-op course in grade 11 and 12
- -students are required to travel to the placement location
- -Laurie and Candice show students transportation routes
- -students are not required to find a co-op placement and Laurie and Candice find a suitable placement
- -if the placement is not suitable, Laurie and Candice manage these situations on an as needed basis with mid placement re-accommodation if necessary
- -two banks are also participating
- -Laurie and Candice are committed to a worthwhile experience for the students and are alert to the needs of the students
- -the parents had a robust question and answer session with Candice and Laurie at the end of the presentation
- -Tracey commended Laurie and Candice for the wonderful program and their leadership of it

b. Guidance - Mary Perin

- -today there was a distribution of a handout if there are changes to be requested
- -there is proactive involvement by guidance for student course choices
- -300 students will be graduating and some students in grade 1 will be afforded workshops to assist them to complete their community hours
- -<neighbourhoodnetwork.org> has a comprehensive list of community hour opportunities
- -summer school courses will be credited after completion
- -summer school schedules will be available in the next 2 weeks
- -Aurora HS will be the summer school location in 2018

-standard is 8 courses in grades 9, 10 and 11 and plus 6 in grade 12 and some students take more courses

 - -Shameela explained that there were 3 facilitation groups
 - -feedback was that it was very informative
 - -facilitator with a video interactive format
 - -comments were about knowledgeable facilitators and informative

 - -suggestion that more info about pre-teens
 - -Peter explained the question the course suggested be asked if someone identified a person whom they thought might be depressed "Sometimes when people are missing work, worrying about things and withdrawing from friends and family, they are thinking about suicide. Are you thinking about suicide?"
