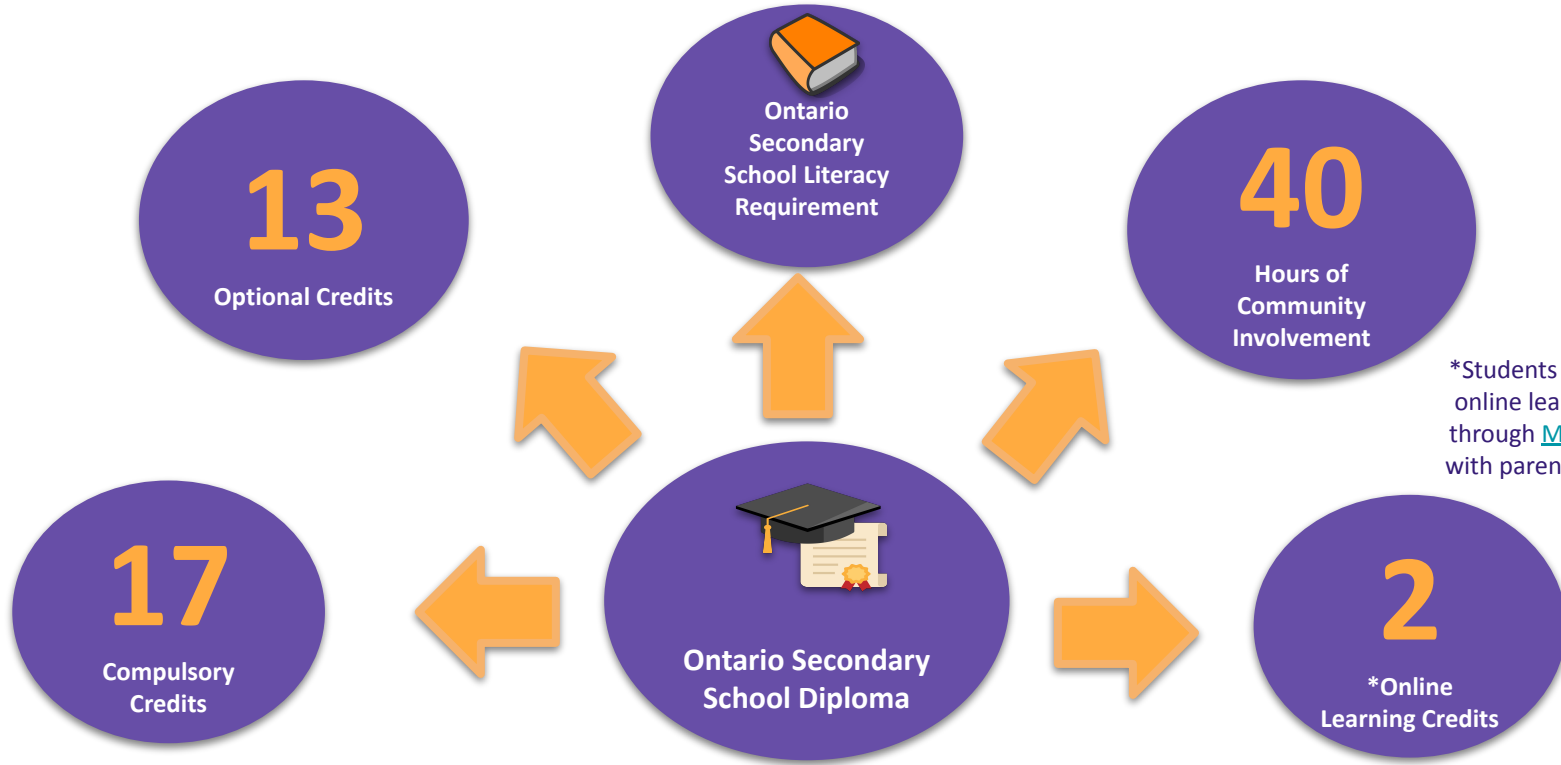

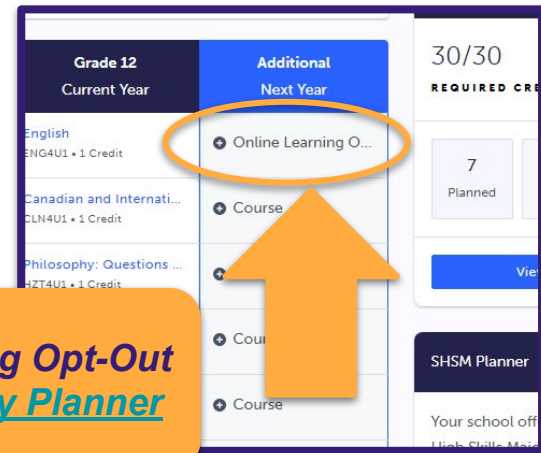


# Online Learning Opt-out

<b>3</b> credits in Mathematics (Grade 9 & 10 plus 1 in Grade 11 or 12)	<b>1</b> credit in Health and Physical Education
<b>2</b> credits in Science	<b>1</b> credit in French as a Second Language
<b>1</b> credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)	<b>0.5</b> credit in Career Studies
<b>1</b> credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)	<b>0.5</b> credit in Civics & Citizenship
<b>1</b> credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)	<b>1</b> credit from the STEM-Related Course Group

**STEM-Related Course Group**  
You must complete **ONE** from the following group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Studies
- Cooperative Education\*\*\*
- Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- Technological Education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

**In addition, students must complete:**

- ☒ 13 optional credits - 4 can be earned through Dual Credit programs
- ☒ 40 hours of community involvement activities
- ☒ The Provincial Literacy Requirement (OSSLT or OSSLC)
- ☒ Earn at least 2 credits through Online Learning\*\*

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English. The fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.  
\*\* Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning requirement should speak to their child's school.

**Notes:**

- Starting in September 2025, students must earn a new Financial Literacy Graduation Requirement as part of their compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics course. Students will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn their high school diploma.
- Students achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.

**French Immersion Students**

**To qualify for the French Immersion Certificate, students must take at least 10 credits in French Immersion (out of the 30 credits needed to graduate high school). These include:**

- 4 French Immersion French (1 credit per grade)
- Grade 9 Geography
- Grade 10 Civics and Careers
- Grade 10 History
- at least 3 other courses taught in the French language (excluding third languages since the language of instruction should be the third language)

\*\*\* Cooperative Education can qualify as 1 French Immersion credit if students are working with a French speaking community partner in a 2 credit Co-op program.

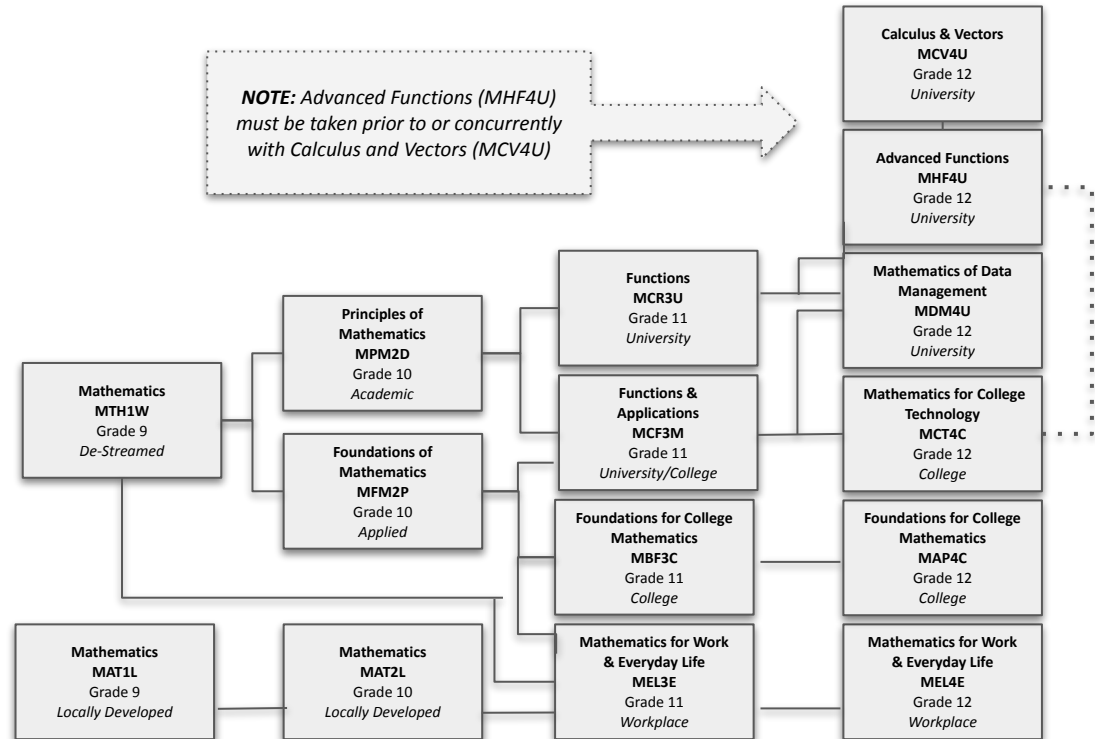

# French Immersion Program



In order to graduate with a French Immersion certificate, students must complete a minimum of **10 credits in French Immersion** of which four (4) are **compulsory** French Immersion language courses.

**GLE102 (Learning Strategies)** supports the transition to Grade 9 and is taught by a FI teacher. An IEP and IPRC is requirement.



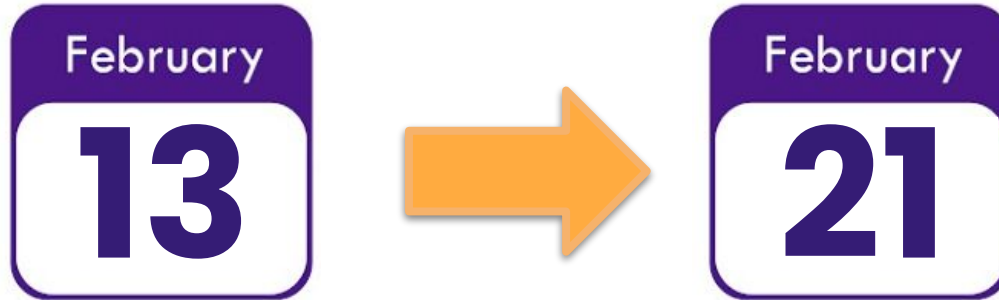
