



NHS French Immersion Program Course Selection Planning Chart

Ten (10) French Immersion credits are required for the French Immersion Certificate, including four (4) FI French courses, one from each grade, which are prescribed. A minimum of six (6) additional FI credits must be earned from the non-prescribed FI program options in order to meet the FI certificate requirements.
