


Online Learning Opt-out







30 Credits: 17 Compulsory Credits and 13 Optional Credits

Compulsory credits are comprised of the following:

4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)	1 credit in The Arts
3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9 & 10 plus 1 in Grade 11 or 12)	1 credit in Health and Physical Education
2 credits in Science	1 credit in French as a Second Language
1 credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)	0.5 credit in Career Studies
1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)	0.5 credit in Civics & Citizenship
1 credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)	1 credit from the STEM-Related Course Group

STEM-Related Course Group
You must complete ONE from the following group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Education
- Cooperative Education***
- Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- Technological Education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

In addition, students must complete:

- 13 optional credits - 4 can be earned through Dual Credit programs
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- The Provincial Literacy Requirement (OSSL or OSSLC)
- Earn at least 2 credits through Online Learning**

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English. The fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
** Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning graduation requirement should speak to their child's school.

Notes:

- Starting in September 2025, students must earn a new Financial Literacy Graduation Requirement as part of their compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics course. Students will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn their high school diploma.
- Students achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.

French Immersion Students

To qualify for the French Immersion Certificate, students must take at least 10 credits in French Immersion (out of the 30 credits needed to graduate high school). These include:

- 4 French Immersion French (1 credit per grade)
- Grade 9 Geography
- Grade 10 Civics and Careers
- Grade 10 History
- at least 3 other courses taught in the French language (excluding third languages since the language of instruction should be the third language)

*** Cooperative Education can qualify as 1 French Immersion credit if students are working with a French speaking community partner in a 2 credit Co-op program.



In order to graduate with a French Immersion certificate, students must complete a minimum of **10 credits in French Immersion** of which four (4) are **compulsory** French Immersion language courses.

This course is designed to develop the oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. Students will analyse literary texts from contemporary and historical periods, interpret informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on the use of strategies that contribute to effective communication. The course is intended to prepare students for the Grade 10 academic English course, which leads to post-secondary or college preparation courses in Grades 11 and 12.



Some teachers may provide extra help sessions at lunch if additional support is needed. You can also connect with a peer tutor in **Student Success**.






Transitioning to NHS

The 1:1 Program

Improves learning and engagement as students become critical thinking **CREATORS WITH** technology rather than **CONSUMERS OF** technology.

- A teaching and learning environment in which each participating student and teacher has access to a personal device on a direct and continuous base for **educational purposes**.
- **Students do not share their technology with other students** but take ownership over their own device.


