


# Online Learning Opt-out

**Compulsory credits are comprised of the following:**

4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)*	1 credit in The Arts
3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9 & 10 plus 1 in Grade 11 or 12)	1 credit in Health and Physical Education
2 credits in Science	1 credit in French as a Second Language
1 credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)	0.5 credit in Career Studies
1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)	0.5 credit in Civics & Citizenship
1 credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)	1 credit from the STEM-Related Course Group

**STEM-Related Course Group**  
You must complete ONE from the following group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Studies
- Cooperative Education\*\*\*
- Mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- Science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- Technological Education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

**In addition, students must complete:**

- 13 optional credits - 4 can be earned through Dual Credit programs
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- The Provincial Literacy Requirement (OSBL or OSSLC)
- Earn at least 2 credits through Online Learning\*\*

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English. The fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.  
\*\* Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning graduation requirement should speak to their child's school.

**Notes:**

- Starting in September 2025, students must earn a new Financial Literacy Graduation Requirement as part of their compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics course. Students will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn their high school diploma.
- Students achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.

**French Immersion Students**

**To qualify for the French Immersion Certificate, students must take at least 10 credits in French Immersion (out of the 30 credits needed to graduate high school). These include:**

- 4 French Immersion French (1 credit per grade)
- Grade 9 Geography
- Grade 10 Civics and Careers
- Grade 10 History
- at least 3 other courses taught in the French language (excluding third languages since the language of instruction should be the third language)

\*\*\* Cooperative Education can qualify as 1 French Immersion credit if students are working with a French speaking community partner in a 2 credit Co-op program.





**Canadian History since World War I**

Grade 10   Apple CHC2D1   1 Credit   Academic

This course explores social, economic, and political developments and events and their impact on the lives of different individuals, groups, and communities, including First Nations, Métis, and Inuit individuals and communities, in Canada since 1914. Students will examine the role of conflict and cooperation in Canadian society, Canada's evolving role within the global community, and the impact of various individuals, organizations, and events on identities, citizenship, and heritage in Canada. Students will develop an understanding of some of the political developments and government policies that have had a lasting impact on First Nations, Métis, and Inuit individuals and communities. They will develop their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating key issues and events in Canadian history since 1914.

**Summer School**: Registration occurs in April/May through [My Pathway Planner](#) and requires approval from your Guidance Counsellor.


