Before you Apply



- **SIX (6) Grade 12 U/M courses** in order to apply to undergraduate programs
- Certain **careers** require an university degree
- University offers a more **independent and theoretical approach to learning** with typically **FOUR (4) years of study**
- Understand **graduate program requirements** (Master, Doctorate, etc.)

To consider:

- **Faculty:** the department of study
- **Program:** the specific area of study
- **Degree:** Bachelor of Applied Science (BASc), Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BSc), Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA)



Before you Apply → Research



What are you looking for?

- **Graduate Studies:** What are the recommended undergraduate programs? Do you have the prerequisites to apply to these undergraduate programs?
- **Employment:** Are you looking for paid internship opportunities and/or work study? Does the university offer employment support?
- **Financial Planning:** What scholarships and/or bursary programs are available?
- **Opportunities:** Are you looking to play varsity sports? Are you looking to pursue an exchange?
- **Student Life:** Would you prefer to commute or live on campus? What would be the financial difference? Would you prefer to live in a large city or a smaller city?



Before you Apply → Research



Student Services

- What exam accommodations are offered? What documentation may be needed?
- Is there an Indigenous Centre and/or affinity spaces?
- Are academic advising and/or career services available?
- How accessible is the campus (ie: libraries, residences, cafeteries, gyms, etc.)







Additional Admission Criteria

A high school transcript is just 1 piece of information Queen's University uses when making an admission decision. Each applicant to Queen's has a personalized To Do List, detailing exactly what is needed to complete their application. Students can review their To Do List (and associated due dates) on their Queen's SOLUS Student Centre. Students will receive instructions for accessing SOLUS after they apply.

Language Requirements

Applicants who meet 1 of the following criteria do not need to submit a test of facility in English:

- You completed an International Baccalaureate (IB) diploma (completion of SL English B is not sufficient).
- You lived in a country where English is the acknowledged primary language for the most recent 3 years prior to beginning your university studies.
- You attended an educational institution full-time where the medium of instruction is English for the most recent 3 years prior to beginning your university studies.

Offers of Admission

All offers of admission made to Ontario high school students by Queen's University, prior to receiving final grades and completing the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), are conditional. Decisions can be based on final Grade 11 results (with registration in appropriate Grade 12 courses), final first semester Grade 12 results and/or Grade 12 interim results.

Basic Requirements for Admission

The OSSD and six 4U/M courses, including English 4U, are required. Please review the specific program requirements for more details, as some programs require additional courses at the U-level. Average calculation is based on prerequisite subjects, plus the next best 4U/M courses, for a total of 6 courses.

Note: The Engineering admission average is calculated using only the 5 prerequisite courses.

A high school transcript is just 1 piece of information we use when making an admission decision. Each applicant to Queen's has a unique To Do List, detailing exactly what is needed to complete their application. Students can see their To Do List (and the due dates) on their SOLUS Student Centre. We will send students SOLUS access information after they apply.

Failed and Repeated Courses

Ontario universities support full disclosure of all marks achieved in all attempts of a high school course. At Queen's, all undergraduate programs will use the most recent grade achieved when calculating the admission average.

To Consider

- Offers of admission are based on **SIX (6) Grade 12 U/M courses**, which includes program prerequisites
- Some programs have minimum course averages (e.g.: 70% in ENG4U)
- Each university calculates admission averages differently. Connect with the university to be informed about their procedures. **Cut-off admission averages** may differ than information posted on [ONInfo](#).
- **Offers of admission are conditional** and may be rescinded once all final marks are received. Connect with the university to learn about their policy.



You are a Group A applicant if **all** of the following are true:

- You are currently taking 1 or more courses at an Ontario high school
- and**
- You are under 21
- and**
- You have an OSSD **or** are working toward an OSSD with six 4U/M courses

B

You are a Group B applicant if you do not meet the Group A criteria.

For example, you are:

- Not currently taking a course at an Ontario high school
- A Canadian outside of Ontario
- An international applicant
- A transfer student
- A mature applicant
- 21 or over and taking a course at an Ontario high school

When you Apply



To consider

- All final marks of completed Grade 11 and 12 courses are visible.
- **List all schools** you have attended (e.g. summer school, night school, private school, etc.)
- Some universities consider ranking of programs. It is suggested to list in order of preference.
- Review **repeated and/or failed course policy** and confirm **equal standing** for MOE recognized courses.
 - Some universities may accept July 2024 summer school grades by an August deadline, while others may why courses were completed outside of day school (e.g. University of Waterloo).



When you Apply



To consider

- Some universities may require students who have not completed their last 3 to 4 years of high school in a country where the dominant language is English to provide a **language proficiency test score**. Each university has different English language requirements for the accepted tests. Some universities may offer English for Academic Purposes program for students who do not meet the English language proficiency requirement. Connect with the university to learn more.

- **Change programs up until January 15, 2025**

When you Apply



Out of Province Applications

- Apply directly to the university. Review requirements and deadlines.
- Some universities will access final marks through OUAC:
 - Bishop's University
 - Concordia University
 - Dalhousie University
 - McGill University
 - Simon Fraser University
 - University of British Columbia
 - University of Calgary
 - University of New Brunswick
 - University of Victoria
- **Request for transcripts requires at least 1 week for processing**



When you Apply



Applying to Schools in the United States

- Make an appointment to review the application process with your Guidance Counsellor.
- Applications are often facilitated through **Common App**.
- Review college/university in regards to:
 - Deadlines
 - Application fees
 - Personal essay
 - Test policy
 - Recommendations
- **Request for transcripts requires at least 1 week for processing.**

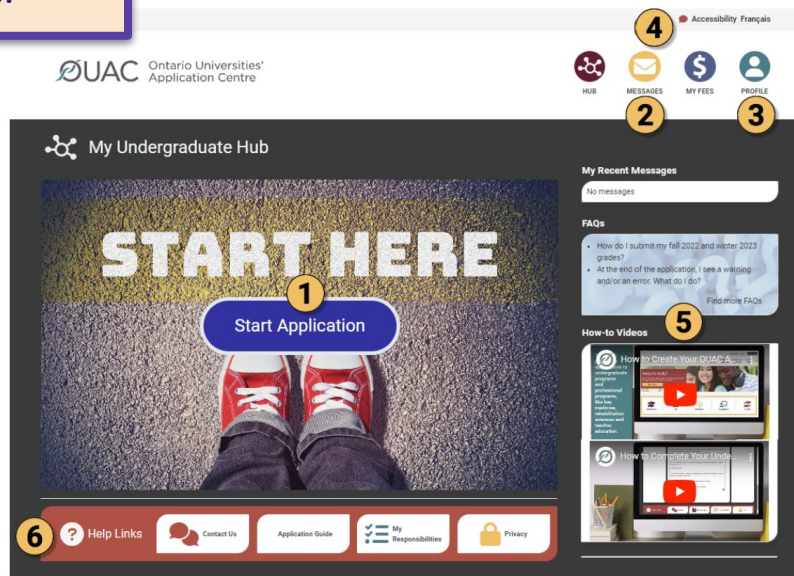

- An interview
- An audition
- A portfolio
- Essay questions
- Resume

You may be asked to create a separate account using the university platform. There may also be **non-refundable additional costs** that accompany these supplemental applications with **various due dates**.

After you Apply



Asking for a Letter of Reference

Ensure you **ask at least 2 to 3 weeks** prior to the submission deadline. You may consider:

- Approaching a teacher who would be able to share about your academic contributions, your leadership experiences and/or specific achievements
- Provide details in regards to whom the letter should be addressed

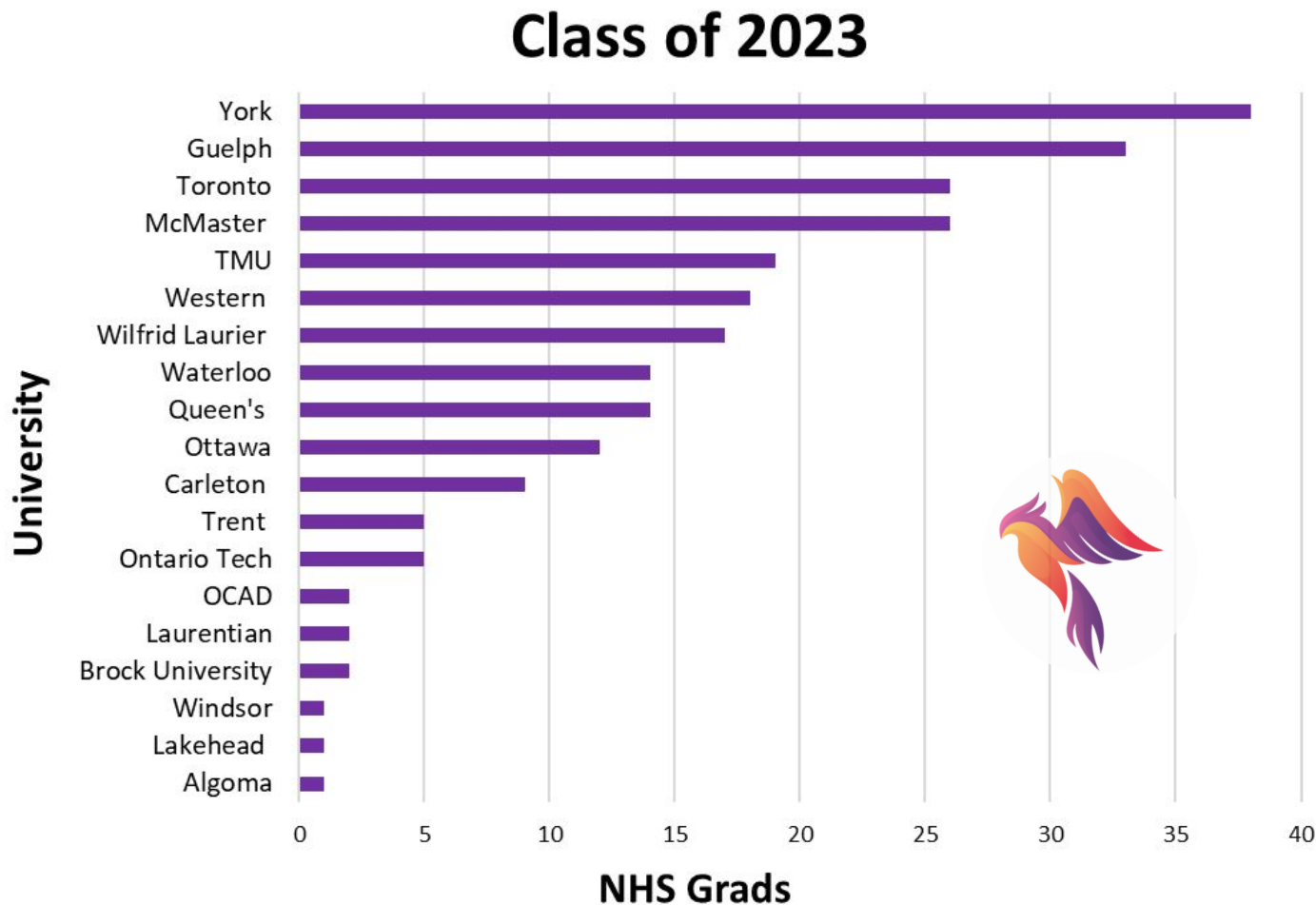

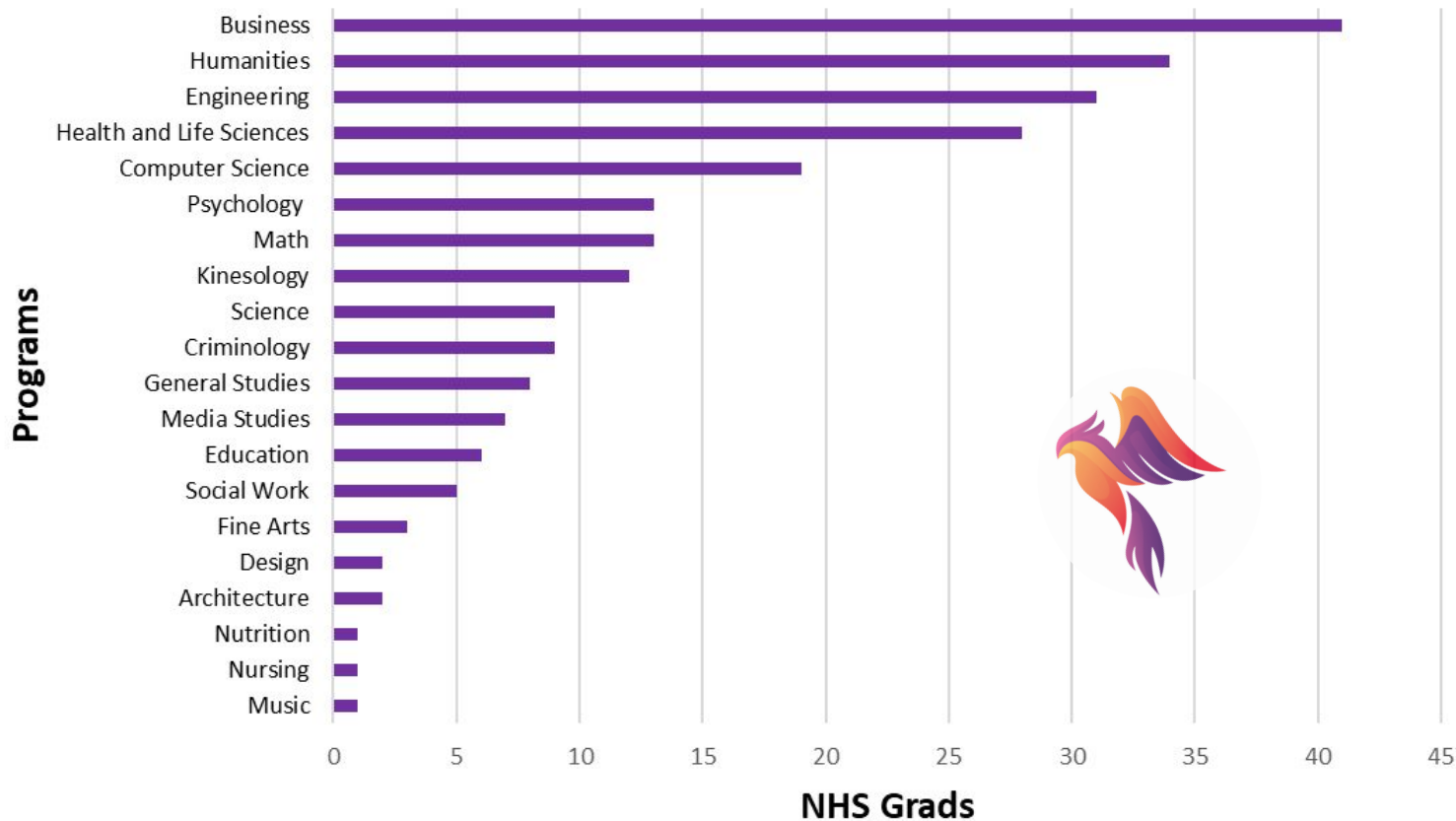
