What do you need to graduate? 18 compulsory credits Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain

the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
- credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- credits in science
- credit in Canadian history
- credit in Canadian geography
- credit in the arts
- credit in health and physical education
- credit in French as a second language
- 0.5^{-} credit in career studies.
- 0.5^{-} credit in civics

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

New

group 1: additional credit in English, or French as a second language, ** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education***

- New
- group 2: additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language,** or cooperative education***
- New
- group 3: additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second language,** or computer studies, or cooperative education***

In addition, students must complete:

- 12 optional credits†
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement

^{*}A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards

- The vision of the French program in Ontario is that students will communicate and interact with growing confidence in French
- French is a compulsory subject, mandatory from Grades 4 to 9. Students are encouraged to study French in Grades 10 to 12
