Important Dates

- November 21, 2016 First date that the 2017/2018 application data is sent to colleges. Also the earliest date colleges may notify applicants that they have received their application.
- <u>November 23, 2016</u> First semester marks are due. Schools may transmit marks for full-year courses as soon as they are available.
- February 1, 2017 Deadline to apply to highly competitive programs. Also the earliest date colleges may release offers to applicants.
- <u>May 1, 2017</u> The most common deadline for confirming offers of admission (applicants should check their offices of admission to confirm deadlines).
- **June 15, 2017** Earliest date colleges may require payment of tuition fees.





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

To be eligible for admission, you must possess the following:

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent including these required courses:

- Grade 12 English (ENG4C or ENG4U or equivalent)

- Three Grade 11 or Grade 12 C, M or U courses in addition to those listed

College or university transfer status

All applicants whose first language is not English must meet Humber's English Language Proficiency Policy.

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Our Program

Because fashion is an international business, Humber's Fashion Arts diploma program places an emphasis on retail operations from both domestic and international perspectives. You will study marketing, store planning and merchandising, brand management, cosmetic marketing, event planning, and retail buying. You'll also learn fashion trend forecasting, sales techniques, and colour and styling analysis, while attaining basic knowledge of fashion products and fashion promotion. These skills are then applied to product launches, planning merchandise as ortments, styling fashion shoots and the production of fashion events.

Our advisory committee provides regular review and input of curriculum ensuring our program is always on the cutting edge of industry developments.

In first year, the ways in the business of fashion - marketing strategies, product knowledge, trend forecasting, web merchandising - give students an

Your Career

Fashion is a major industry in Toronto. According to the Toronto Star, retail alone generates annual sales of \$2.6 billion in the Greater Toronto Area's (GTA's) 4,600 fashion stores. A fashion career offers numerous and varied opportunities. Work as a buyer, associate buyer, planner, distribution marketing manager in retail or mall management, or an account manager in cosmetics. Work in wholesale as a sales agent in apparel, accessories or cosmetics. Our graduates can also pursue careers as fashion and trade show co-ordinators, shopping centre marketers, visual merchandisers, merchandise allocators, buyers, and marketing assistants to fashion designers and manufacturers. Those who prefer the freedom of self-employment may find opportunities such as freelance photo styling, image consulting and event planning.

Work Placement

Narrow college program selections to a maximum of <u>five program choices</u> with no more than three choices from one college.

If I am repeating a required course but not until second semester, will you still consider it? Some Important things to Note on College Admission Requirements

 College admission requirements can vary a great deal from college to college, even when the program title is the same.

 Most college diploma programs require college (C) preparation courses to meet specific course admission requirements but will also accept university (U) or university/college (M) courses. The most commonly required courses for admission to college **Diploma Programs** are:

Grade 12 English (ENG4C) Grade 12 Math (MAP4C) Grade 11 or 12 Sciences (SBI3C, SCH4C, SPH4C)

Looking for Degrees at College?

If you wish to take a <u>Bachelor's Degree Program</u> at college you must meet the admission requirements for university (6 Grade 12U/M courses) with a minimum average of 65% to be considered for admission

If you wish to take a <u>Collaborative (Joint College-University) Program</u> (e.g. nursing), you must meet the admission requirements for university before you can apply (6 Grade 12U/M courses), and sometimes application through OUAC is required

Thinking about college as a stepping stone towards University study?

Most college programs now have agreements in place with specific Universities that allow transfer into specific University programs. The Ontario College-University Transfer Guide lists articulation agreements, and credit transfer agreements between Ontario Colleges and Universities that will help you plan your pathway options.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you are applying to highly competitive programs, you should consider applying before this date. See your guidance counsellor if you need help.

FEBRUARY 1ST Equal Consideration Deadline

An important date for three reasons:

- applications received at OCAS on or before this date will be given equal consideration in the application process
- applications (or changes to program choices) received after this date are considered on a first come, first-served basis!
- colleges start making offers of admission on this date

Highly Competitive Programs

for some programs it is projected that the number of qualified applicants will far exceed the number of available seats available for the fall start date

these programs have been designated by the colleges as 'Highly Competitive"
 for these programs <u>applicants MUST apply by February 1st</u>

Highly Competitive Programs Cont'd

- If applying to 'Highly Competitive' programs, students are encouraged to <u>apply as early as possible</u> as there are often enough qualified applications received by February 1st to fill the program
- Typically there will be additional steps you will need time to complete in the application process (e.g. interview, portfolio, etc.)
