




Students must earn at least two online learning credits to receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

OSSLT Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

- The OSSLT is administered in Grade 10. The assessment is based on a variety of cross-subject Ontario curriculum expectations for reading and writing.
- Accommodations, deferrals and exemptions may be appropriate for some students.
- The results of the OSSLT are reported as successful/unsuccessful. Students who are unsuccessful will be given clear feedback regarding their performance in order to retake the test or if the student enrolls in the Literacy Course to satisfy the diploma requirements.









- Make a commitment to complete your community involvement hours as soon as possible.
- Encourages civic responsibility, promotes community values and reinforces importance of volunteerism.
- You can start your hours during the summer following Grade
 8 graduation no earlier than July 1st.
- Guidelines and forms will be provided to help track community involvement.
- Register online with Neighbourhood Network to be notified about local volunteer opportunities.

What can your child expect?

- Students can expect instruction and evaluation in each of these four areas, with an emphasis on developing lifelong language learners and critical thinkers.
- We expect that they will be communicating in French with their peers and their teachers in FI classrooms.
- Students are encouraged to seek out opportunities to practice their French outside of the classroom



In order to graduate with a French Immersion certificate, students must complete a minimum of **10 credits in French Immersion**.


Four of these are **compulsory** French Immersion language courses:

To qualify for the French Immersion Certificate, students must take at least 10 credits in French Immersion.
