Offers of Admission for Ontario High School Students

Basic requirements for admission

All conditional offers are contingent on the completion of all high school diploma requirements, including a minimum final admission average of 80%. Some programs may specify other conditions, including higher final admission averages.

Basic requirements: At least six 4 U/M courses, including all <u>required courses</u>, as specified for each program. EAE4U will be treated as equivalent to ENG4U.

Failed and repeated courses and courses other than day school

Timing and process for admission decisions

We anticipate making a relatively limited number of offers of admission in December and continue with a large number of offers of admission on a rolling basis beginning in February.

In highly competitive programs, such as Engineering, Mathematics, and Software Engineering, most decisions will be made in mid-May. Admissions committees for these programs like to have more information, including updated grades and contest results, so that they can make fair and equitable decisions.

Offers of residence and information about scholarships will accompany the offers of admission; scholarship decisions will be made in May

Programs Requiring Prior University Study

Ontario Postsecondary Transfer Guide (ON Transfer) All offers of admission and scholarships will be made by May 28, 2015, and applicants will have until June 1, 2015, to respond. If you know that the University of Waterloo is the university that you wish to attend, we encourage you to accept your offer as soon as you receive it.

If you are not admitted to the program you applied to, you may be considered for admission to an alternate program in the same faculty, provided you meet the minimum admission requirements, and places are available.

If a program is available in both co-op and regular and you are not admitted to the co-op program, you will be automatically considered for either the corresponding regular program or another related program, provided places are available. In some programs, limited admission to co-op is also available in second year.


Deferred Admission: One-year <u>deferrals</u> of admission may be granted to high school applicants. **Note:** You will not be granted a deferral if you will be studying at another postsecondary institution.

Note about admission averages: The admission averages listed are based on the previous year's entering classes. They are affected by the number and quality of applicants and the spaces available, and will not be known until mid-May. Other factors will be considered, as well as grades.

Note about programs: The programs listed are entry programs only. We offer more than 100 areas of study within these programs.

Current Ontario High School Students (101)

Complete the 101 online application if you meet **all** of the following requirements:

- You are taking courses during the day at an Ontario high school (this includes students returning for second semester and graduated students returning to upgrade one or more courses).
- You have not, at some point, been out of high school for more than seven consecutive months.
- You will have received or expect to receive your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with six 4U/M courses at the end of the current year.
- You have not attended a postsecondary institution (college/university/career college).


101 Application Process


- Students eligible to apply to university should have received a letter which includes - School Mident Number, Student Number and PIN Number
- Keep your PIN number confidential
- Prepare your online application & pay online (\$140 for 3 program choices)
- Additional Choice fee is \$47.00 for each university/program

Important Final Steps...

- Print your OUAC reference number (2015-XXX-XXX-X)
- Record your <u>PIN</u> and keep it in a safe place (you will need it to change your application and accept an offer of admission)
- Use your OUAC reference number and PIN to access the on line "Review and Change your completed Application" system

Supplementary Application

- make a professional email
- check your email regularly

- provide references or proofreaders enough time to support you

Reminder of Important Dates

- ▶ January 14, 2015 last day to apply online
- May 28, 2015 Date by which you should receive a response
- ▶ June 1, 2015 earliest date to which you must respond to an offer of admission



Offers of Admission

- evaluation of application files are performed at each university and admission decisions are made by the universities (OUAC does not make any admission decisions)
- the universities will communicate offers of admission directly to the applicant
- when applicants are offered admission, they will be provided with the appropriate instructions for responding
- applicants are able to accept or decline offers of admission using the "Review and Change Your Completed Application" feature
- offers are made at different times throughout the processing cycle, depending on the university and program
