**REMINDERS:** Outdoor play time is part of every child's day and it's important that your children come to school prepared to be outside. Warm coats are a must, and at this time of year we recommend sending your child to school with a hat, gloves or mittens, and even boots to help keep her/his feet warm. Once the snow season is here additional clothing such as scarves, snow pants, and more are also suggested. School staff do monitor daily weather forecasts and conditions when deciding whether or not students should go outside, we consider shortened recesses when temperatures are very low, or when heavy rain is occurring.

**Progress Report Cards:** Progress Reports will be sent home with all students on November 22nd. The purpose of this Progress Report is to communicate the progress your child has been making since the beginning of the school year. The Progress Report also indicates how well your child is demonstrating the various learning skills and work habits and identifies areas where you may be able to support your child. This report is not an evaluation or a record of achievement levels and doesn't not include any achievement grades. The Progress Report Card at this time of year reflects preliminary observations of your child's learning to date. It is our hope that the Progress Report will serve as a central part of rich discussions between home and school.

**Parent-Teacher Interviews and Student-Led Conferences:** As you know, all parents will be invited to attend an interview or a student-led conference being held on November 23<sup>rd</sup> (PM) and November 24<sup>th</sup> (AM). Parents of students in JK have been invited to attend a classroom observation mid-November. This year all bookings for students from SK to grade 8 are to be made online using our new YRDSB Edsby platform. At this time, all families have been invited to set up an Edsby account and bookings will open to our school community beginning the morning of November 13<sup>th</sup>. You will receive an email notifiying you that Edsby bookings are now open. If you have any trouble at all, please contact the school office and we will gladly lead you through the steps or complete the booking for you. By using this platform all families will have the chance to select interview times most appropriate for them. In addition to scheduling interviews with your child's core classroom teacher, you will also be able to schedule interviews with any other teachers in the school as well.

As always, if the interview dates do not work for you, a quick phone call to your child's teacher can often help alleviate your concerns, or it can act as the first step toward further discussion and planning for your child's success. Regardless, I encourage you to be in contact with your child's teachers at any time if questions or concerns arise.

## **School Bus Cancellations and Delays**

School bus service may be delayed or cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region. Decisions are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature and road conditions.

#### **BUS DELAYS**:

Buses that are delayed on their morning or afternoon route are listed under the "Late Bus Report" tab at <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u>. Under this tab you will find all routes that are running late, listed by route number, along with the number of minutes they are late. It is critical that you know the bus route number for your child's morning and afternoon buses in order to read the late bus report!

#### **BUS CANCELLATIONS:**

- A decision to cancel school bus transportation may be **system wide** (where all buses in York Region are cancelled) <u>or municipality specific</u> (where buses in one or more municipalities are cancelled).
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is cancelled and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is operational, your child **will not** be transported to/from school.
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is operational and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is cancelled, your child **will not** be transported to/from school.
- If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

### Flu Season is on its way – are you ready?



Flu season is nearly here. Be prepared by getting the flu shot as early as possible.

The first and best step to preventing influenza (the flu), is to get the flu shot every year. Influenza spreads quickly and easily from an infected person to others.

Everyone six months of age and older can get the flu shot. Flu shots are

available at:

- Health care provider's offices for people six months of age and older
- Participating pharmacies, for people five years of age and older

Visit ontario.ca/flu to find where you can get the flu shot.

#### How can the flu be avoided?

- Get the flu shot!
- <u>Wash your hands</u> well and often with soap and warm water. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based <u>hand sanitizer</u>
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue out immediately. Wash your hands afterward. Cough into your upper sleeve if you don't have a tissue.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Avoid large crowds and stay home when you are sick
