INFORMATION & UPDATES

THANKS FOR A GREAT FIRST WEEK: It was a pleasure to welcome students and families back to school this week. It is so wonderful to have the hustle and bustle back in the hallways! Students and teachers are already hard at work creating collaborative classrooms and engaging in our beginning of year learning activities!

BOOK OF FORMS: This week, the Board has sent an email to all families with a link to a Google Form to complete the start-up forms. The form will include: the Start-Up Permission Form (mandatory), a Student Information Consent Form (mandatory), a Request for Faith Accommodations Form and a School Council Nomination Form. Student GAPPS login information will be required for families to complete the forms. Please contact the school office if you require printed copies of these forms. Please note this is also where you indicate your child's lunch preferences.

COMMUNICATING WITH YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL: Please help us as our partners in supporting student safety. We must respectfully ask that if you wish to communicate with your child during the day, you report to the office rather than approaching your child outside on the tarmac at recess. When you come to the office, we can facilitate having them brought down to meet with you or arrange to have them speak with you on the phone. Photos/videos of your child/children should also not be taken at school in order to respect the privacy of all other families whose children may be caught in the photo. Thank you for your continued support in helping keep all students safe.



DROP OFF/PICK UP ROUTINES: Parents please note that students are encouraged to walk to school, when possible. If you are driving your child/children to school in the morning, please drive to the end of the Kiss and Ride loop that continues all the way around to the west side of the parking lot. Once your child/children are out of the car a staff member on duty will direct students to the appropriate

location. Please note, there is no parking in the loop as we would like to keep traffic flowing slowly through the Kiss and Ride.

STUDENT ABSENCES/EDSBY: If your child(ren) will be absent from school, please ensure that you enter their absence in EDSBY. You can call in your child(s) absence using the automated INFORM system, (905) 727-4224 before the start of school. Please specify the correct reason for the absence. If the absence is coded as "approved absence", the school office will be calling home for further clarification. In the notes section, you may also provide further details for example: funeral, illness, medical appointment, etc.



REVISED GRADE 1,2,3 AND 6 SOCIAL STUDIES CURRICULA: The Social Studies curricula for Grades 1, 2, 3 and 6 have been revised to include increased learning on the perspectives, experiences, and contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples, communities and nations. They also include learning on residential schools and the impacts of colonialism. Mandatory implementation of these curricula will begin September 2023 and is now available for families and educators to view on the Ministry website.
