School Bus Information

For information on bus routes, stop locations, times, late arrivals, cancellation, eligibility, registering a complaint, safety and general information, please visit www.schoolbuscity.com or contact the York Region Student Transportation Services School Bus Information Line at 1-877-330-3001.

A student's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to his or her grade and distance from home to school:

- All students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.
- All students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation.

We will be updating our bus attendance list throughout the first month of school. <u>If your child is eligible to ride the bus, but will not be using this service, please call the office and let us know as soon as possible.</u>



Join us for School Council

We look forward to working closely with our School Council to best meet the needs of the Northern Lights Public School community. School Council is made up of parents, staff and community members who meet to plan and support our school across a variety of areas.

Our first School Council meeting and elections will be held on **Monday, October 2, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.** in the school library. Those wishing to serve on the School Council as an elected member (chair or co-chair, secretary, treasurer, executive member) need to complete a School Council Nomination Form contained within the School Book of Forms. Those seeking a position must be in attendance at the first meeting. It is expected that School Council executive members attend all regularly scheduled School Council meetings and events. Please note that there are many parents and guardians who consistently attend School Council Meetings and strongly support School Council events who are not elected executive members, but support our work as members at large. *Everyone* is welcome to attend and support the work of the school.

Lunchtime Expectations

Students are expected to eat lunch at school and stay on school property at lunch recess. Please help your child by packing a nutritious and litterless lunch each day. Be sure to include healthy snacks and drinks as well. We do not encourage dropping off fast-food for your child.

Please indicate whether your child will be going home for lunch in the Book of Forms. Students who have permission to leave for lunch must sign out, and in, daily in the binder in the school office.

Allergies

While we take every step to create a risk-free environment, school staff and parents can take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions. It is especially important that parents communicate a life-threatening allergy to the school as soon as they are aware of it. Please notify the secretary and your child's teacher so that we take the steps to create accurate records and inform staff of the established protocol. Our school community can support all of our children by reading ingredients carefully, and sending only nut-free lunches and snacks to school.

Volunteers in our School

Volunteers are welcome and greatly appreciated at our school. In accordance with the York Region District School Board's Policies and Procedures, all volunteers who may be interacting with students are required to have Police Vulnerable Sector Check (PVSC). You will be required to bring a request with you from our school. Please visit the office if you are interested in volunteering throughout the school year (in the school, or on trips). We will provide you with a letter that you can take with you to a customer service location. Please visit this link for cost and locations. Generally, if you go in person you will receive your documentation at your visit. Then, bring this documentation back to the school for us to file. If you have obtained a PVSC within the past year, you will not need to complete a new one. Rather, you will only need to sign an Annual Offense Declaration and a Confidentiality Agreement.

School Communication

Almost all of our school communication is distributed via email. There are a number of families who have not provided their email addresses. If you have not been receiving our emails, or are new to the school, please call the office to **provide your current email address** and/or ensure you update your child's index card with your email address when it comes home during the first week of school.

In addition, York Region District School Board requires your consent to receive any electronic messages which contain advertising or promotions regarding school fundraisers, lunch programs, field trips, the sale of yearbooks, purchasing of student photos, books, prom or dance tickets, athletic events with an entry fee or similar events and offers. In order to receive these types of emails, you must subscribe on our school website by entering your email in the "subscribe to electronic communications of a commercial nature" box. If you have already subscribed, you do not need to do so each year.

We are sending a paper copy of the September newsletter, however all other editions will be sent by email.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Our first and foremost commitment is to provide a safe environment for more than 500 students and we ask that all drivers —whether dropping students off or simply commuting to work—drive with particular care in and around the school. Given the traffic congestion challenges associated with having hundreds of students dropped in our Kiss and Ride each day, we would once again encourage you to walk your child to and from school whenever possible.

Parents and guardians who drive your children to school, we would ask you to please abide by the following:

- approach the school patiently, with consideration for pedestrian traffic, other drivers, and the staff on duty
- the Kiss and Ride loop is on the south side of the school; drive cautiously all the way to the top of the loop so that a number of vehicles can drop off at the same time, once your child exits the vehicle, proceed around the loop back onto Bridgenorth Drive
- take care when merging back into the inner driving lane; no student should be dropped off from the inner driving lane and subsequently walk between vehicles
- avoid distractions such as texting or using the phone
- never direct your child to walk through the parking lot
- at pick-up, if you do not see your child (or children), drivers are asked to continue to circle the Kiss and Ride and pull up curbside only when you see your child
- at no time should a vehicle be left unattended or otherwise parked in the Kiss and Ride
- kindergarten students will follow the same procedure but will be escorted by a staff member into their respective kindergarten enclosure
- do not drop your child (or children) off in the bus loop

For students who take the bus to school, please ensure that your child is at the bus stop in advance of the time given to you on the school bus website. Be patient, as the buses are sometimes delayed by traffic. You can check for updates about late or cancelled buses on www.schoolbuscity.com.

Students who use bicycles, rollerblades, skateboards or scooters to travel to school, please remember the following:

- you must wear a helmet
- you are to walk while on school property
- you should lock bicycles on the bike rack
- you need to store rollerblades, skateboards or scooters in your locker or backpack
- the school is not responsible for any lost or damaged personal items

We will continue to monitor our arrival and dismissal procedures with our students' safety in mind. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.
