2015-2016 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION


New kindergarten student registrations began at the school on **January 16th at 9:00 a.m.** and will continue moving forward. If you have not registered yet, please ensure you have all of your important documents ready before arriving to avoid any delays. Forms can be completed upon arrival or in advance and brought to the office on registration day. In order for an application to be complete, we must have the following:

- Kindergarten registration form complete with signature
- Proof of child's age (such as a birth certificate or passport)
- Proof of residency in the form of a land tax assessment (final copy) and one utility bill (phone, hydro etc.). If you are new to our area an offer to purchase (house) or lease agreement will be accepted.
- If you have a child entering Kindergarten that has a special need, please ensure you inform the office.

WINTER WEATHER

Colder weather is now here and all students from JK to Grade 8 are expected to go out for all recess breaks, therefore everyone should come to school ready for winter weather outdoors for 30 minutes at morning recess and up to 40 minutes after lunch. We always monitor the weather and in extreme conditions e.g. wind chill; we keep the students indoors and/or simply shorten the recess breaks.

Please make sure that your children are dressed properly for our invigorating winter days. It is advisable for students to bring extra pants and socks for wetter conditions. Please be sure to label all articles of clothing (including indoor shoes). Boots, hats, mitts/gloves, scarves, and snow pants for the younger children will help make recess an enjoyable time.



BUS TRANSPORTATION

Parents, students and staff are always advised to access various radio and television stations for POSSIBLE bus cancellations on inclement weather days.

PARKING LOT AND KISS N' RIDE

Given the size and structure of our parking lot and kiss n' ride, we have decided to make a few changes in attempt to speed up the process of student drop off and pick up. We will be opening up the bus loop/emergency vehicle loop at the front of the school for student drop off starting at 8:35 am (or slightly after) depending on when all buses have left the loop. As usual, please note that supervision before and after school is located at the back of the school only (not at the front) starting at 8:30 am in the morning and ending at 3:30 pm after school. We are hoping that by opening the bus loop as a secondary kiss n' ride option that it will assist in expediting student drop off. In order for this change to be successful and safe, we ask that when accessing this loop that you:

- 1) Access it only after 8:35 am.
- 2) Make sure all buses have left the loop before entering
- 3) You do not leave your vehicle unattended at any time while in the loop (as it is an emergency loop)

It can often be a rush getting students to school in the morning especially on winter mornings however we stress that <u>safety is more important than convenience</u> and advise all parents who drive students to school to exercise the proper amount of caution and patience in our parking lot and our student drop off loops. Signs and staff are available to assist the safe flow of pedestrians before school begins each day. As always, families and students are encouraged to walk to and from school. We will be reviewing the success of this change and will report back in next month's Newsletter. All and any feedback is welcomed.
