INTERNATIONAL HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY: January 27 is International Holocaust Remembrance Day. This date was designated by a resolution of the United Nations General Assembly in November 2005. The day reaffirms "that be a warning to all people of the dangers of hatred, bigotry, racism and prejudice (UN General Assembly A/60/L.12)." This day serves as an international Memorial Day for the victims of the Nazi Holocaust. January 27 marks the date when the Nazi concentration and extermination camp of Auschwitz-Birkenau was liberated by Soviet troops in 1945.

NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR THE CITY OF QUEBEC MOSQUE ATTACK: The National Day of Remembrance of the Quebec City Mosque Attack and Action Against Islamophobia will be commemorated on January 29th. SNOWY DAY PICK-UPS: Please be mindful that we do not have additional supervision available for students after school in the office. If buses are canceled and you bring your child to school on a snowy day, please remember there must be a plan in place to collect them from school at the end of the school day as well (3:15). If you work far from school and know that it may be difficult or impossible to pick up your child at the end of the day in bad weather, please consider who will be picking your child up in your place.
