STUDENT ARTWORK:



Ms. Jada's class (with the assistance of Ms. Turney), created this display in our foyer to help us recognize Diwali at school. Diwali, or Dipawali, the Hindu festival of Lights, is one of the biggest festivals in India. Diwali gets its name from the row (avali) of clay lamps (deepa) that Indians light outside their homes to symbolize the inner light that protects from spiritual darkness and symbolizes the victory of light over darkness.
