- Walk to School Safety Message Increasingly, we are seeing students engage in unsafe walking behaviours before and after school, when walking on their own or with a group. Please be sure to discuss and practise the following safety rules with your child, to ensure a safe walk to and from school:
  - Cross at a designated corner, with a crossing guard or adult
  - Never dodge/dart across a main road Bridgenorth or Earl Stewart)
  - Never walk across the bus loop at the front of the school
  - Never walk through the parking lot, follow along the sidewalk to the tarmac instead
  - Never wear earphones or text/browse while crossing a road/driveways
  - When crossing, make eye contact with the stopped driver
