Principal's Message

Our students and families once again demonstrated their generosity during the holiday season as we collected food for the Richmond Hill Food Bank and toys for the York Regional Police for their Holidays for Heroes campaign. Another special project saw some of our students visiting area seniors to share music, stories and conversation. Our students were so proud of their outreach to the community and we thank our families for thinking of others during this time.

Our eco team, led by Mr. Potyok and Mrs. Fairy, has been transforming the way we manage our waste products. All classrooms now have small recycling bins, green bins and even smaller garbage cans. Student leaders are checking these daily and monitoring lights and screens. According to our caretakers we have been doing a far better job of reducing our garbage. Did you know that you can bring batteries in to the school for safe disposal? Containers are available at the front of the school.

Term One Report Cards will be issued on **February 12th.** As always teachers are available to discuss student progress prior to this date. Our teachers communicate to parents in a variety of ways - student agendas, monthly calendars, class newsletters and websites are some examples. If you are not receiving these communications please contact your child's teacher.

With some families leaving early for holidays at this time of year, or any other time, we are often asked the question: "What about work my child is missing?" We suggest your child read for pleasure, keep a journal of their activities and contact a classmate for due dates. Since much learning that takes place in the classroom is interactive and collaborative, it is not always possible to provide written materials to make up for classes missed due to extended vacation.

You may have heard that the YRDSB has undertaken a renewal of its mission, vision and values' statements. 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Winter Tips for Parents

With winter definitely upon us here are a few tips for comfort and safety:

I) Make sure your children are dressed for the weather and that they have indoor shoes at school. We go outside most days and on those days when the conditions are deemed too cold, we try and have students outside for a part of recess.

- 2) If your child is well enough to attend school the expectation is they are to be outside at recess.
- 3) Please use the walkways that are cleared as your path to walk to the doors. Parents and caregivers should ensure they are wearing proper footwear, along with the children. Slips and falls can occur very easily at this time of year and we want everyone to remain safe!
- 4) If buses are cancelled in the morning due to weather conditions it means they will not run in the afternoon so if you bring your child(ren) to school you will need to make arrangements for them to be picked up in the afternoon.
