When I walk through the school now I am so pleased with the amount of garage that has decreased, and the amount of recycling that has increased. Our student led Mental Health Kick off Assembly was a huge success, and we are now excited to announce that we will now be continuing our journey with a student led Wellness Fair! Students from grades 5 – 8 and their families will have the opportunity to learn about topics pertaining to mental health and healthy living that are relevant to our students!

Students and their parents will be guided through 3 sessions where a keynote speaker will be addressing topics such as effective strategies to manage stress, anxiety, and depression, building self-esteem and a positive self-image, and breaking down the barriers around mental illness. Afterwards, there will also be an opportunity to gather information from organizations throughout York Region

pertaining to Mental Health and Healthy Living. These organizations will have booths set up in the gymnasium and representatives will be able to answer questions you may have.

Helmet Safety

Cycling is the most popular outdoor activity among young Canadians; unfortunately, every year 50,000 children are seriously injured in bike related mishaps.

- Wearing a certified helmet can reduce the risk of serious head injuries by 85%
- Children and youth (under 18) are required by law to wear a helmet with the chin strap clip fastened under the chin when cycling
- Head injuries are the #1 cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels—a helmet could save your child's life
- Kids imitate their parents, 98% of children will wear their helmets if their parents do. Wear one
 every time you ride
- Before age 10, most children do not have the skills to cycle safely on the road; they need help to make good choices



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
School Council News
