Help Us To Keep Our Students Safe: Some Reminders

Recess Playground Expectations

Each School's code of conduct outlines acceptable behaviours for students. During playground time, the code of conduct applies and includes the following:

- I. Harmful behaviours toward others is not acceptable (e.g. play fighting, piggybacks, pushing, rock/stone/sand/snowball throwing, etc.).
- Show respect for fellow students, teachers, school assistants and administrations.
- 3. Swearing is not permitted.
- Spitting is not acceptable, whether playing sports or not.
- 5. All students are responsible for keeping school property clean and tidy.
- 6. All students should stay out of the swales (gullies) and away from the trees.

Traffic Safety

Here a few reminders of our safety measures:

- 1. The parking lot will be blocked off as of 8:50 in the morning.
- Parents are asked to drop students off either on Parkston or Driscoll. Both of these streets have walkways into the school
- 3. If you chose to drop your child off on Lucas, please do so just beyond the exit of the school
- 4. Please remember that our Bus Loop is a no parking zone at all times.

Report to the Office Please

Please remember that the first place to visit at school is the office. The only way that we can assure the safety of all students is with <u>your full participation!</u>

A "Sign-In" sheet is located in the office, and requires all visitors or volunteers to sign in when entering the building. Please sign in at the office and obtain a "Visitor" badge so that you can quickly be identified by staff in the halls. Going directly to your child's classroom only causes clutter and confusion in the hallways.

Make arrangements to meet your children outside a specific door. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated as it makes it easier to identify anyone who should not be in the school.

Student Absent or Late?

If your child is going to be away from school for any reason, please give the office a call at **905 884-5711** and leave a message. On a busy day with many absences, confirming the whereabouts of every absent child can take quite a while and could result in a child missing for some time.

The York Region District School Board has been advised by the police that if a student has not arrived at school, and after all steps have been taken to contact the parents, emergency contact etc., they wish to be informed immediately. Please make sure that the school office has been provided with emergency contacts that can be easily reached.

Search & Seizure

As per the protocol between the York Region District School Board and the York Regional Police, please be aware of the right of school administration to search school property, such as lockers, desks and backpacks, without notice to or permission of any person. Also, from time to time, police may be invited onto any school premises to conduct their own searches without notice to or permission of any member of the school community other than the school principal.

Attention Bussing Parents Important Transportation Message

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Re: Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Self Identification of students with First Nation, Métis and Inuit Ancestry

PROMOTING SUCCESS FOR STUDENTS OF FIRST NATION, MÉTIS AND INUIT ANCESTRY

The York Region District School Board provides an opportunity for students with First Nation, Métis and Inuit ancestry to self-identify. The process is voluntary and the information gathered will be kept confidential.

The self-identification process is the first step in providing:

Culturally specific learning opportunities or activities;

Additional support for academic achievement and well-being, including designated support staff;

Communication between schools, First Nation, Métis and Inuit Education staff, Aboriginal students and their families;

Connections to post-secondary institutions, community groups, service providers and other partners;

More learning opportunities for all members of the school community to develop a greater understanding of Aboriginal perspectives, cultures and histories.

New students can self-identify when they register with the Board. Current students can complete an Aboriginal Self-Identification Form which can be obtained from their school.

School zone safety



The rush of cars, buses and children arriving at school can create many dangers. Help keep kids safe on the way to and from school.

Drivers:

- Slow down and be ready to stop for school buses and pedestrians
- Respect the crossing guard's instructions
- Be aware of children running in front or behind buses or other obstructions (snow banks)
- Arrive early to avoid traffic congestion
- Make sure your child gets out from the passenger side of your vehicle
- Park away from the school and walk your child onto school property

Teach your children to:

- · Stop, look and listen before stepping out of a car or bus
- Walk only on the sidewalk and follow the crossing guard's instructions
- Be seen by the drivers (make eye contact) before crossing.
- Not run or cycle across the road
- Not use cell phones or ear phones when walking
