### **AT A GLANCE INFORMATION**

**FDK Registration for 2019-2020:** Kindergarten registration for September 2019 begins January 18 for the 2019-20 school year. This year, our school is excited to be one of the pilot schools in the Board offering online registration for Kindergarten. Children who turn four or five years old during 2019, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten.

Please note that for this pilot, a laptop or desktop computer is strongly recommended, rather than a mobile device. Families are still welcome to register in person in the school office. 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
## Available School Assistant Positions for 2018/2019 at Oscar Peterson Public School

You will supervise students in the classroom for 20 minutes and then for recess for 40 minutes (outdoors, weather permitting).

We are currently in search of at least two more assistants to help supervise on a daily basis, from 12:40 p.m. to 1:40 p.m. We also welcome "casual" assistants who are only available on certain days rather than 5 days a week, or on call. The areas of supervision are rotated occassionally, so flexibility is appreciated. We fully train all new assistants!



#### Red Cross Babysitting Course (with first aid & CPR) Offered by Stayin Alive With First Aid, CPR & AED

Caregiver and first aid skills for youth 11 to 15 years old. Participants learn how to manage difficult behaviour, gain essential leadership skills, and discover professional conduct for babysitters. Babysitting promises to deepen and enhance the responsibility that older youth feel when caring for younger children. The curriculum is complete with new science about giving appropriate care in the event of an emergency.

## JANUARY 2019 - ACTIVE SCHOOL TRAVEL NEWSLETTER

Welcome back! For January, we have some tips for how to get outside and still have fun in the cold, including while you're walking or wheeling to school or the bus stop.

- Being dressed for the weather is the first step to enjoying the outdoors. Here are a few suggestions on how to stay warm:
  - Wear a base layer
  - Wear an insulating layer (wool socks, shirt and pants but not jeans or cotton)
  - Wear an outer shell (windproof jacket with a hood and snow pants with elastic or velcro fastening at the cuff)
  - Wear insulated waterproof snow boots
  - Have a hat that covers the ears (and a spare!)
  - Add a neck warmer
  - Finish with waterproof mittens
  - Keep moving!
- Eat high-fat snacks to keep your body going.
- Drink water! Even though it's cold, the air is dry and your body can become dehydrated.
