Membership is available for one (1) year or two (2) years on the Parent, Family and Community Engagement Advisory Committee (PEAC) to commence in November 2019. The Board will approve membership terms, as required. There are currently six (6) positions available. To check the respective schools in each area (CEC East, West, Central and North) use our <u>school locator</u>.

Two references are required, one of whom must be any YRDSB staff member. Parents/guardians who are also employees in the Board are asked to self-identify when applying. References are kept strictly confidential.

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
Available School Assistant Positions for 2018/2019 at Oscar Peterson Public School

The areas of supervision are rotated occassionally, so flexibility is appreciated. We fully train all new assistants!
