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

Students in Grades JK-6 are to complete the survey at home with the help of a family member. Our Intermediate students in Grades 7 & 8 will complete the survey at school during school hours.

Hello parents and guardians of Oscar Peterson Public School. This week we will be informing you about upcoming events in your child's school community, as well as a recap on what has already happened. We encourage you to inform your students about these upcoming events and ask them questions as you see fit.

First off the robotics club is starting up again! The first meeting was on Tuesday Nov sixth.. The students who signed up will program and build robots to complete different challenges. Practices will be on Tuesday at 7:15 am before school and on Thursdays during lunch recess. ECO TEAM

Our Eco Club this year is about to launch our first new initiative. Our club is student run and they have decided that **November will be "Litterless Lunch" month here at OPPS.** The club selected this as the issue they are most interesting in pursuing first. We are asking that all students/families focus on litterless lunches for the month. Here are some highlights about what they students are going to implement.

- 1. Divisions will be competing to see who is the most successful.
- 2. Classes will get 1 point per reusable water bottle, 2 points per litterless lunch and, if their teacher is participating, 5 points for every staff member's lunch that is litter free.
- 3. Lunches that are **litterless** will count if **they do not** have any **garbage** straws, straw wrappers, plastic, foil, etc. We will not discount lunches that have recycling or compostables.

COLD WEATHER

During the cold winter months, it is important that students come to school dressed for the weather conditions. This includes: boots, hats, scarves, snow pants, warm coats and mittens or gloves. We also encourage packing an extra pair of socks and pants in case they get wet.

All students are expected to go out for every recess and lunch hour, weather permitting. We monitor the weather throughout the day, including temperature, wind chill, sun/cloud conditions and wind velocity. In <u>extreme weather conditions</u>, such as ice pellets or extremely high wind chill factors, administration may decide to shorten recess breaks or keep students indoors.

Students with illnesses serious enough to prevent them from participating in recess, physical education, or other outdoor activities should stay at home until their condition improves. This will also prevent the spread of illness to others.



SCHOOL BUS SERVICE

School bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/ transportation arrangements. Since some bussing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m. or earlier, all cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to ensure the safety of our students. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region.

Decisions are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature and road conditions. Please note the following:

- A decision to cancel school bus transportation may be system wide (where all buses in York Region are cancelled) or municipality specific (where buses in one or more municipalities are cancelled).
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is cancelled and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is operational, your child will not be transported to/from school.
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is operational and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is cancelled, your child will not be transported to/from school.
- If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore, students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

HEAD LICE

Like everywhere else, there is the potential for head lice in York Region and at Lester B. Pearson. It's important to check your child's head if they've been in contact with someone who has lice or if they appear to have an itchy scalp and are scratching a lot. Don't panic! Be sensitive to your child's feelings and check your child's head right away. Checking for lice takes patience, diligence and plenty of time.

Effective treatment means:

- Check all family members
- Treat only family members that have head lice
- □ Apply a head lice treatment as directed Remove all the nits (eggs)
- □ Know the facts talk to a Public Health Nurse.

If your children have lice, please let the school know, there is a Policy we need to follow regarding lice.

Head lice

Head lice are tiny insects that live on the scalp, where they lay eggs. Head lice do not spread disease. It's not your fault if you or your child has head lice.

Having head lice does not mean you are not clean.

What do head lice look like?


Lice have 3 stages - the egg (nit), the nymph and the adult.

- Nits are whitish-grey, tan or yellow ovals, about the size of a grain of sand. They stick to the hair close to the scalp and can look like dandruff. Nits hatch into nymphs in 9 to 10 days.
- Nymphs are baby lice. They look like adult lice but smaller.
- Adult lice are hard to see since they are about the size of a sesame seed. Adult lice can live for up to 30 days on a person's head, but they die within 2 days away from the scalp.

Our school will communicate more information as features become available.


For Edsby to be effective, it contains personal information about you and your family that is collected by the Board at registration. This information is used to provide services and support to you and your family. Edsby has been designed as a secure system that protects the privacy of this information for our families.

Setting up your Edsby Account for the first time

An email from York Region District School Board was sent with instructions on how to create an Edsby account. Make sure the school office has your current email address on file.

If you do not see the email, please check your junk mail folder to ensure you do not miss this opportunity.

- Click the link in the email. The browser will send you to a screen like the one on the right.
- Click the "I don't have an Edsby parent account" button. Your username will be your email address. You will choose your password. Similar to a banking password, it is important to choose a strong password. Please do not share your password.
- Click "Create Edsby Account." A "Welcome to Edsby" message will be sent to your email address.

FLU SEASON IS HERE

Get the flu shot as early as possible



The first and best step to preventing the flu (or influenza), is to **get the flu shot every year**. The flu spreads quickly and easily from an infected person to others and anyone can get it. Getting the flu shot can protect you, your family and those around you.

Students may be at higher risk of getting the flu as they come together in close public spaces including the classroom, gymnasium, lunch room and library.

The flu shot is especially important for students who have a chronic condition (e.g. asthma, diabetes) or those who live with or have close contact with a pregnant woman, kids less than five years old, or a resident of a nursing home or other chronic care facility since these groups are at higher risk of getting very sick or being hospitalized because of the flu.

Flu shots are free and are readily available at:

- · Health care provider's offices for people six months of age and older
- Participating pharmacies, for people five years of age and older

In addition to getting the flu shot annually, here are some other health tips that can help prevent the spread of the flu:

- · Wash your hands well and often with either soap and water or alcohol based hand rub
- Cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze (if you do not have a tissue, cough into your upper sleeve)
- · Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- · Stay home when you're sick
- · Clean and disinfect surfaces and shared items

It's important to get the flu shot as early as possible as it can take nearly **two weeks** for the influenza vaccine to take full effect.
