Halloween Protocol

Each year, many of our students celebrate the long-standing tradition of Halloween. We are however cognizant that all families do not acknowledge nor support the day. At Oscar Peterson, we respect the views of our students and families we work with and seek to find inclusive ways for all students to participate without compromising their beliefs.

Our staff have been planning activities that allow for and value multiple options for participation (i.e. wearing orange and black or autumn colours, other themes beyond ghouls and ghosts) but do not require students to be segregated from their peers.

When planning your costumes please be aware that costumes at our school must comply with the Safe School's policy. Costume accessories including, but not limited to, toy guns, knives, axes, swords, etc. are not in compliance with York Region District School Board's Safe Schools Policy #668.0. Furthermore, that all costumes should be respectful of others. For example, if something is representative of a person's culture or religious beliefs, then it should not be worn as another person's costume

Please note that this policy applies to all students at all levels, including Kindergarten.

Finally, if **your child is planning on bringing in treats on Halloween, they must bring their own healthy snack as** we have students who are severely allergic.
