### MILK BAGS TO MATS

## Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Me to We Committee is collecting milk bags as one of our initiatives to help make our world a better place. We are asking for your help in making this recycling project successful. The milk bags will be used to make sleeping mats that are in great demand in third world countries. It takes about 400 bags to crochet a 3'x6' sleeping mat. Sleeping on these mats help to protect children and adults from parasites such as hookworms and biting insects. These plastic mats are durable, with a life expectancy of 20 years+ and they are easy to wash and dry. They provide an alternative to sleeping on the bare and/or wet ground. We are also helping the environment by recycling these milk bags into useful articles, as it will take them years to decompose in the landfills. PLEASE, SAVE the large outer 4 litre milk bags and send them to the school with your child or, you can drop them off yourself. Before sending them in, please make sure that they are clean and flattened.

## 4. E.Q.A.O. ASSESSMENTS (Grades 3 and 6)

The Primary (grade 3) and Junior (grade 6) assessments will take place from Monday, May 26 until Monday, June 2, 2014. During this time students in these two grades will complete the assessments for Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Where necessary, accommodations are put into place for children requiring additional support. Both the Primary and Junior assessments are a measure of a students learning to date in relation to the Ontario Curriculum. The results of this assessment, along with other forms of data, provide the school with information that will further our instructional practices and guide our school improvement planning. During this time we ask that you try **not to schedule any appointments or vacations** as it is important that the students are at school every day and on time. This will allow for minimal disruptions, consistency in the administration of the assessment and ensure the assessment is completed within the given time frames.





## 5. June 26th, 2014 Early Dismissal in Elementary Schools

All students have received a copy of the *2013-14 Learning Calendar*. Please note that on **Thursday**, **June 26**<sup>th</sup>, **2014** an early release day will take place to allow elementary teachers and support staff to participate in activities in the afternoon of that day in support of student achievement and school planning.

Students will attend school during the morning of Thursday, June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2014 only. More details will follow closer to the date.

## 6. School Climate Survey for Parents/Guardians

Between May 20 and June 2, we will be inviting parents/guardians to participate in a school climate survey. The surveys provide the Board and our school with valuable information about how you feel about the school environment and your child's education. The results will be used to identify areas that need to be addressed, monitor progress and plan strategies to support student achievement and well-being. We value parent input and encourage you to complete the survey. The information parents provide will be anonymous, considered confidential and kept in strict accordance with all relevant legislation. Information about how to access the survey will be sent home with students later in May. Please contact the school if you have any questions.

## 7. A Few Reminders

For the safety of our students, we would like to remind parents that they are not allowed in the school hallways and classrooms during school hours unless they sign in, receive a visitors tag and have a scheduled appointment.

Supervision: At Oscar Peterson P.S. our supervision begins at 8:35 in the morning and ends at 3:30 in the afternoon. Please ensure you drop off and pick up your child during these times to ensure they are properly supervised.
