- Jason To De-streaming Presentation February Council Meeting
 - Bio: Jason is a high school mathematics teacher who's taught primarily in the northwest corner of Toronto. Currently, he serves as the Coordinator of Secondary Mathematics and Academic Pathways in the Toronto District School Board. His role is to support the TDSB with challenging academic streaming from K-12, paying particular attention to inclusive and culturally responsive mathematics instruction. He views math education through the perspective of equity, inclusion and anti-oppression and its intersection with student identities. As a powerful tool and vehicle for social change, he sees math as student empowerment and ensure they see its learning as a social enterprise that challenges them to



think critically and collaboratively. He is also a staunch advocate for the elimination of streaming in education — that is, the separation of students into distinct learning pathways based on students' perceived abilities and identities.

 Will share more about de-streaming and explain, discuss the inequities and why de-streaming is important.
