A claim against the Yukon Government as they do not have school boards.

While the lawsuit lists problems specific to Robert Service School, such as the shuttering of the occupational therapy room and an absence of any data collection to identify and follow up on students' needs, it also takes aim at alleged systemic issues with special education across the territory. Some facts - 70% of gd. 7 students are not reading at grade level. If students are expected to graduate high school, they are not given IEP. Only students are not capable of graduating only get an IEP.

Streaming has real and perceived roadblocks to entry to university. Data suggests that there is a clear equity and anti-oppression rational for de-streaming. Taking college prep math isn't going to necessarily set students up for success. Locking students into a 'stream', does not support. In order to enhance learning, teachers should be using High-Impact Instructional Practices in Mathematics. Classrooms should be set up as collaborating/vertical/non-permanent writing platform practices as a type of math learning. Leveraging technology to provide students who require assistance, such as Assistive Technology – a calculator as an example. Also include small-group instruction. Triangulation: Fair & Equal – Using Products, Conversations and Observations.

Q: Teachers who are used to teaching a different way. What's being done for them?

A: A new way for learning, boards are putting a lot of focus on inclusive learning. Look at what school improvement plan is, and what action is being put forward.

Q: Is de-streaming only happening in grade 9?

A: Covertly, in elementary – they were being pulled out for students who were identified in special education – program was dismantled, support being pushed into classrooms.

Inter-school sports

Board has shared that inter-school sports are now allowed. We haven't started at OPPS, as staff are not ready due to a number of factors. Some inter-murals with cohorts. Some clubs going on, Chess, Reach for the Top. Right now, it's up to the teachers and there are no teachers on our end to do this right now. Mr. Izzo is working on in-school competitions. Admin will find money to support these right now – achieving success, for mental health & well-being.

Q: What is the process when a teacher goes on an LOA?

A: Teacher is supposed to of leave 3 days of work. If teacher provides LOA > 15 days, medical note – to HR, to tell Admin. Once Admin gets it, post jobs for 3 days. Look at applications, interview process, reference checks, etc.

Q: What about communication to students who don't understand what's going on with missing teachers?

A: Normally the Admin and/or Teacher sends a communication/email to families.

Q: What's going on w. Grad?

A: We're still looking for direction on what can be done for Grad. We still can't plan anything w/out knowing what Public Health Guidelines are. Maybe around this time we book a hall? Per Mr. Whitton, it's been booked, we haven't lost money and if we are able to use it, we will. Not sure about equity related to vaccination status – as this is a parent/guardian choice vs. a student's choice. Booked at Spring Lakes – Monday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. Outdoor venue related to be able to do this if vaccination is an issue.

Pink Shirt – Recap (Pauline)

T-shirts & sweatshirts – 106 items. Went smoothly. Made \$138 surplus, to be donated. May suggest another Sprit Day to wear the shirts again.

School Lunch Programs (Naz/Kate/Natasha)

Board has release ability to do programs now, however volunteers are not able to enter school. Talked with Leadership team and speaking on behalf of Intermediate Classes – would be willing to have a class/grade 8 help distribute. Rotate monthly. Deliveries need to be closed/wrapped with names.

Natasha – due to increasing costs from vendors. Last time we ran program was 2019 school year. For pizza it was Pizza Nova, bought 8-slice pizzas at \$9.75, we made 140%. Cost from vendor \$5, made 25% on sale. To make similar margins, Pizza Nova & Pizza Pizza – set price based on \$3.00/per slice. Rely on parent volunteers for Pizza Nova and they can't give individual packages. Pizza Pizza will give individually packages slices which are \$5.50 we sell for \$6.90, will make about 70%. Subway, combo has gone up. Another option is to offer the sandwich only.

Pros/Cons – Subway was good at organizing classrooms. Doesn't raise as much money. If we only go with one program, will make more money than Subway. We've never relied on Pizza Pizza before.

Q: What day of week? A: Flexible day for Pizza Pizza days. Wednesday for Subway.



Naz: Only approving 1 vendor due to equity and delivery factors.

• PRO Grant – Approval

Will partner with 2 other schools. Looking to do at the beginning of April – if they have anything in the works for a speaker.
