Administrator's Update & School News

Naz

- PEAC Symposium May 4th Virtual
 - The purpose of PEAC is to provide a forum for sharing of information between parents and the board. The
 Symposium is virtual and will have interesting Keynote speakers and breakout room with different workshops.
 More than 20 workshops are being planned.
 - Due to the fact that the Symposium is virtual, each school can send 10 representatives instead of 3 as was in previous years.

- Class planning for next year
 - Class placement forms will be sent out with the school newsletter on Friday and will be due mid-May.
 - The class placement form is intended to capture the strengths and needs of a student, teaching styles that are suited for the student and peers that a student would like to be in the same class with. It is not intended to be used to ask to be in a specific teacher's class. The information is used in placement meetings with teaching staff.
 - Staffing numbers are usually determined at this time of year, but it is on hold because of the decision to have a separate EVS next year. Deadline was April 7 for parents to submit whether their children will be attending EVS so once those numbers are known then staffing numbers will be determined.
- Grade 8 Graduation
 - The committee met with Spring Lakes. Graduation date is set for Monday, June 27. Menu options are being discussed.
 - o Grade 8 hoodies were ordered.



- o Is there going to be a grade 8 trip? The Board has put all field trips on hold. Discussions will be held once the Board has lifted the restrictions.
- Time for grad still working out details.
- X-movement potential for Spring date
 - o Naz is trying to book them for May, and also for the Fall. Naz will provide an update for next meeting.
- Covid Reporting
 - Question was asked about covid reporting and at what point does Admin make a call to close the school?
 - Answer: In order to provide homeroom coverage for staff that may be off sick or otherwise, some prep coverages are being cancelled in order to fill these positions. There is no specific capacity about closing schools. Attendance is checked every night and a report is sent to the superintendent. Board is hesitant to shut down schools due to hardships to families and is a last resort.

 - We're our 3rd week. It's gone pretty well. Brigitte, Mel, Kate and Natasha have been helping.
 - o Bins a vote was distributed via email to spend \$500 towards the purchase of bins so that the pizza could be packed by class. The vote passed and 30 bins were purchased by Pizza Pizza on our behalf.
 - Pizza Pizza packs the orders by bin. Worked really well. Parent volunteers attach class list to each bin. Takes about 30 minutes.
 - Sold 450 slices in the first cycle. Hoping that sales will go up in subsequent cycles.
 - o Pizza Pizza has been great to work with. Very accommodating.
