### 'Tentative' School Classroom Organization

Listed below is our 'tentative' school classroom organization.. Direction from Collective Agreements and the Ontario Government aimed at reducing class sizes in the primary grades has established strict limits on the number of students that may be included in each classroom from Junior Kindergarten (JK) to Grade 3. The changes will enable more attention to the individual needs of each student and better learning environments for all primary children. As a result, our school organization is <u>VERY</u> 'tentative' at this time -meaning, the teacher your child is assigned at the beginning of September may change. We will monitor our enrolment numbers over the first few weeks and if necessary will make changes later in September.

#### Please note:

Class placement decisions are the result of a comprehensive consultation process involving staff and optional family input and are subject to Ministry of Education and Collective Agreement requirements. As a result, we are not in a position to consider requests for changes to individual class placements at this time.

## Student Busing Eligibility

Did you know that students' busing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

# Your Child's Safety Comes First at P.A.P.S.



No Peanuts, Tree-nuts or Nut by-products or Sesame products at Park Avenue P.S.



School staff, students and parents are responsible for creating a safe and healthy environment for all of our students. This is an additional challenge for schools attended by children with life threatening allergies. While it is impossible to create a risk-free environment, together we can take important steps to minimize potentially fatal allergic reactions.

Please help your child understand that they should not share their lunches. The children at risk may also be made aware, on a regular basis, that they should not take any food other than what has been sent by a parent or guardian. Also remember to pack lunches that are free from products which contain peanuts, tree nuts such as walnuts, almonds, pecans etc or nut by-products including sesame.

If your child has a severe allergy, please contact the office staff to let them know. You will be required to fill out a medical care plan and provide the school with **two Epi-pens**.

In keeping with this policy, please do not send baked goods or products containing nuts to school with your child to celebrate his or her birthday. We are asking food <u>not</u> be brought in to be distributed to students as these products do not guarantee that they have not come in contact with nuts. An alternative to food would be to send in a pencil or any loot bag type object to share with classmates.

#### Free' Medic Alert "No Child Without Program"

PAPS is pleased to offer our students who may have special medical needs / allergies etc. (e.g. severe allergies to drugs, food, insects, anaphylaxis, Asthma, Autism, Epilepsy, Diabetes, Hemophilia etc.) <u>Free Medic Alert support through the "No Child Without Program."</u>

A child participating in this free program will receive membership to MedicAlert, a MedicAlert wallet card, a MedicAlert bracelet or necklet, 24 hour access to the MedicAlert hotline and notification of personal emergency contacts at the time of an emergency. This support is offered free of charge for all students attending Park Avenue PS. Pamphlets are available at the main office.

#### School Zone Safety

The rush of cars, buses and children arriving at school can create many dangers. Everyone plays a role in ensuring the safety of children when they are going back and forth to school.

#### Drivers, to keep kids safe in the school zone:

- Reduce your speed and be ready to stop at all times. Avoid distractions like a cell phone
- Drive cautiously and follow the rules (even when you're late!)

#### Parents, teach your children to:

- Stop, look and listen before stepping out of the car or bus
- Walk only on the sidewalk

# **Your Child's Safety Comes First at P.A.P.S.**





Please remember that the first place to visit at school is the office. The only way that we can assure the safety of all students is with your full participation! A "Sign-In" binder is located in the office, and requires all visitors or volunteers to sign in when entering the building. Please sign in at the office and obtain a "parent visitor" badge so that you can quickly be identified by staff in the halls. Going directly to your child's classroom only causes clutter and confusion in the hallways. Make arrangements to meet your children at their specific entry/exit doors. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and makes it easier for staff to identify anyone who should not be in the school. Thank you!

#### Safe Schools Reminder

Parents are reminded to ensure that their child does not bring any <u>replica</u> weapons, knives, multi tools with knives attached, air guns, or replica guns to school at any time. The Safe Schools policy is very clear to ensure safety for all. Students will be reminded in September and October-especially concerning any Halloween attire. #### Lockdown / Hold and Secure Procedures

Once again school staff and students will participate in our 'Lockdown' and 'Hold and Secure' drills intended to practice school responses to emergency situations. The purpose of the 'Lockdown' response is to minimize risk to students and staff to the presence of an armed or dangerous intruder or other similar violent threat within the school. The purpose of the 'Hold and Secure' response is to have students stay inside the school, lock all exterior doors, and resume business as usual in our school. The 'Hold and Secure' response would be used if an armed or dangerous intruder was in our neighbourhood. We will practice our first Lock Down drill during Safety Week (week of Sept. 24th).
