- Coding has been a part of the curriculum updated in curriculum as students are behind in math especially – outcome of COVID
  - Curriculum Blue Bot Different levels Unplugged, Icon-based, Block-based, Textbased (not a Elementary level)
  - o Demonstration Microbit Organization is in UK \$30 each
  - 10 Chromebooks in library others students bring down from class

### **Administration Report**

- Toy and Food Drive for the holiday Season
- Playground Benches arrived not installed yet (weather permitting)
- Cell phone RIBS submitted Survey to be sent out to parents, staff & students results to be shared & reviewed at next council meeting
- Discussion about cell phones held during meeting: Some of the points made:
  - Admin rolled out unsupervised access to phones during 20 minute eating period advising students directly without any prior input from parents/guardians – concerns raised about the issue that there are many negative impacts of cell phone use, social medial use on youth - especially youth in this age group
  - Guidelines provided but students still on social media, filming/posting during school hours – Concern about managing/supervising guidelines
  - Parents sign no image of minors to be posted online yet images are on social media for pictures taken at school – how is this managed?
  - Concerns raised about the mental health of students overall and the negative impacts of social media on youth – Concerns further raised about the unsupervised use
  - Discussion about student behaviours prior to new rules & after rule change Have behaviours changed?
  - Concerns about distractions, student knowledge about repercussions of online activity, and online bullying occurring
  - Other schools have implemented no phone policy contracts b/w parents & students w/school
  - o Concerns raised about enforcement/punishment for improper phone use
  - Noted that students didn't have access in September but given access December 1/23 students had behaviours but were adjusting
  - Discussion about students interaction and concern about lack of talking to each other/interacting during eating time – social interactions are regressing in smaller nonstructured groupings – social peer to peer pushback
  - o Equity what about kids who don't have cell phones and are made fun of as a result
  - If students/families need communication Can school offer a place in office to use?
- Online concerns from closed Park Avenue Parents Group brought up by Admin:
  - Mice in school pest control increased presence in Kindergarten room public health clearance November 24/23
  - Smell in Kindergarten classroom moved class to library

- Notice sent to families of students affected afterwards concern raised about timing and if this can be sent in a timelier manner
- Pest Control PCO Services green, environmentally friendly, nothing sprayed come in every 2 weeks
- Safety in School SAC concern re: location of SAC in Kindergarten Hall location due to enclosed bathroom – Kindergarten students are coming home and telling parents they are were not allowed to go into hall/use washroom due to "Hold & Secure"
- o Parents concerns are for their children, do support all students right to an education
- Admin proposed reaching out to Principal of Student Services for further discussion with group
- School has staff who are trained and are supportive of students ensure safety of all students
