

School News and Events—Calendar:

Student H Drive Access

For our students who save their school work on their 'H Drive' at school, they are able to access their school files from home. On the home page, students need to go to the drop down menu in the top right hand corner and select 'H Drive'. This will take the students to the login screen for their H Drive.



Student Bussing Eligibility

Did you know that students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

Kindergarten Night

We are hosting our Junior Kindergarten open house on Thursday May 29, 2013 from 6:15 p.m. to 7:15 p.m.

If you have registered your child to start Junior Kindergarten here at Pierre Berton Public School in September, please join us for an evening of educational information, and to help make the transition a smooth one. Each new Junior Kindergarten student will receive a package of educational materials to help them over the summer.

Track and Field Day

On Friday, May 17th, the Junior and Intermediate students at Pierre Berton Public School will be participating in the school Track and Field Day which will be held at Fossil Hill Public School and on the track at St. Jean de Brebeuf Catholic High School. Students will begin their day at Pierre Berton and walk with their classes to St. Jean de Brebeuf and Fossil Hill.

Students will be outdoors for the entire day (8:40 a.m. to 2:50 p.m.) participating in various track and field events. These activities are tied in with the Physical Education program of the school, and it is expected that all students will take part.

Students are encouraged to dress appropriately for physical activity in proper running shoes, shorts or track pants, and t-shirts. Parents are asked to ensure their child comes to school wearing sunscreen as well as a hat and has sunscreen to re-apply, as needed. As well, students should bring a lunch and water bottle. We recommend an environmentally friendly, refillable bottle with their name on it. Students need to prepare themselves appropriately based on the weather conditions.

Class Placements

We are in the process of coordinating class placements for the 2013-2014 school year. Current homeroom teachers, in consultation with receiving teachers, appropriate support staff and the school administration will work to develop balanced classes that strive to best meet the needs of all of our students. All class placement decisions are made after extensive planning, preparation, and discussion on the part of many people. Our primary goal is to develop balanced classes with regards to gender, academic ability and social dynamics.

After working with your child over the course of this year, your child's teachers have a very good understanding of your child's abilities and needs, both academic and social. Each new year brings opportunities for all students to meet new friends and expand their circle of acquaintances. Please be aware that we do not accept requests for specific teachers and/ or for particular groups of students to be placed together.

Open dialogue between parents and teachers is encouraged and has a direct and positive influence on your child's learning. If you have information about your child that may have an impact on his/her ability to learn effectively, you are encouraged to share this information with us throughout the school year.

Parents play a critical role in helping their child make the adjustment to a new teacher and new classmates. Teachers will be working very hard to make sure they create inviting learning environments for all their students. Your active support in helping your child remain positive about the new challenges ahead is important for a smooth transition to his/her new class.

Teaching assignments and school organization for next year will be finalized in August based on student enrolment during the summer and the Ministry mandate to meet primary class size. Students in grades one to eight will be informed of their class placement on the first day of school in September

This month we'd like to review some details about the Kid's Kitchen Hot Lunch Program and our policies including bad weather days.

About us

FOOD BITES

Kid's Kitchen is a family run business operating from a nut-free, commercial kitchen in Markham. Lunches are prepared fresh daily and delivered and distributed to students at lunch time. There are a variety of nutritious lunch options available including halal, vegetarian meals. Our meals are prepared in accordance with the Ontario Food and Beverage policy guidelines. We take great care in preparing meals for students with allergies or dietary restrictions. Please call us with specific questions or requests.

Ordering

Ordering lunches with Kid's Kitchen is flexible and convenient. You can order as frequently as you need and start orders at any time.

Orders can be added, cancelled or changed on-line until 10am the previous business day (on Friday for Monday orders). A valid credit card is required for on-line ordering. If your school accepts paper orders, orders may be submitted in the Kid's Kitchen Drop Box in the school office (please do not give orders to your child's teacher). Please do NOT send cash with orders, as we cannot be responsible for missing cash payments.

Cancellations

We allow same day cancellations until 7am by phone only. Email messages are sometimes not checked until later in the morning. If a lunch is cancelled you will not be charged for the lunch. If it is too late to cancel a lunch, you are welcome to pick up the lunch at the beginning of lunch hour from the school. Any lunches not picked up at school are usually brought back to Kid's Kitchen unless a request is made to leave them at the school.

Bad Weather Policy

Our policy has always been that if school is open, Kid's Kitchen is open and we will deliver lunches. Even if school buses are cancelled, as long as school is open, we are open.

As we have no way of knowing which students will be staying home and who will be dropped off to school, it is the parent's responsibility to call us and cancel their lunch in the morning. We usually accept cancellations by phone on the day of until 7am, however, on bad weather days, we give more grace and will accept cancellations until 8:30am.

Any lunches not picked up at lunch time are usually brought back to Kid's Kitchen unless other arrangements have been made.

Customer Service

We are here to help! We have live Customer Service available from 8am to 3pm Monday to Friday. If you have any questions regarding the Kid's Kitchen lunch program or your child's order, please give us a call at 905-944-0210. You can also send us emails at <u>information@kidskitchen.ca</u>.
