Student Achievement

Inspiring Your Child to Learn and Love Math

This is the third installment of PBPS's "Math Session". In November, we identified clear math milestones kindergarten students to meet by the end of year 2 in kindergarten and strategies that parents can use to become partners in the math learning journey of their child.

In this installment, we will be looking at a few early numeracy strategies primary students consolidate and list some strategies that parents can use to help them through the learning process.

Abstraction

Quantity can be represented by different objects. Any kinds of objects can be collected together to count. For example, the quantity "5" can be represented by 5 like objects, by 5 different objects or by 5 invisible things (5 ideas).

Stable Order

The counting sequence is always consistent. Counting words must be recited in a specific, reproducible order. It is always 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and not 1, 2, 3, 5, 4.

Order Irrelevance

The counting of objects can begin with any object in the set and the total will remain the same.

Hierarchical Inclusion

Numbers build by exactly one each time and nest within each other by this amount. This relationship means that the child mentally includes one in two, two in three, three in four, and so on. After counting 8 objects, a child who does not have hierarchical inclusion will think of 8 only as the final object, not as the quantity of the entire set.

Early Number Concept	Teaching Strategy
Abstraction	Have your child count a set of objects. Make sure that the objects are not the same type. Ask your child to make sets with those objects and tell you how many s/he has in the end.
Stable Order	Have you child count to as high as he or she can. Look for the child to count the numbers in their correct order. Pay specific attention to their ability to say the correct decade numbers, such as 20, 30, 40, etc
Order Irrelevance	Have the child count a set of objects. Then change the order of the objects and have them count from the middle of the new set. Ask the child why the total number of objects in the set are the same no matter where you start counting. The child should be able to tell you because the total does not change no matter where you start counting from.
Hierarchical Inclusion	This is a simple one that becomes an incredibly important foundation for more complex algorithms such as multiplying and dividing. Have your child count a set of objects and ask them how many they have in total. Once the child gives you an answer ask them what it means to have a total?


Incorporating math into everyday activities will make learning math fun and it's an easy way for you and your child to spend quality time together. More importantly, family math time will help with reducing the level of anxiety that students feel when engaged in mathematics.



We learned about arithmetic, reading, writing, spelling, and art, all while writing on black boards with graphite! Some of us even experienced old-fashioned discipline and had to sit on logs for the school house stove.
