Administrators' Message

April 2016

It is hard to believe that it is already April. The weather is finally beginning to warm up and the students are able to enjoy the sunshine outside. It has been a busy few months at Pierre Berton. As part of a project that began in 2011 under the renewable energy fund – the YRDSB has installed a 40 KW Photo Voltaic (Solar) system at Pierre Berton PS. When Pierre Berton PS was designed and built it had structural components added to make this site ready for this type of installation. The 40 KW system will be completed by the beginning of the 2016 school year. In addition, we have hosted several evenings, including Family Math Night and an EQAO parent information night. Students have also had the opportunity to participate in many workshops and field trips to enhance the curriculum. Our grade seven and eight students participated in a Skills Canada workshop looking at pathways for high school and beyond. Scientist in the School has worked with classes and presenters have come into the school to share strategies and supports for bullying prevention and making healthy decisions. We appreciate the support of our community as we work together for the success and well-being of our students.

The students have had many opportunities to participate in extra-curricular events. Many athletic teams have been in place with some excellent results at the area tournaments. Some members of our intermediate basketball teams participated in the NBA All Star Clinic having the opportunity to work on skills and see many NBA players. Our junior boys' and girls' basketball teams are involved in tournaments at this time. Clubs, such as Yearbook, Best Buddies and Student Leadership, etc. have also enabled students to become actively involved in the school life at PBPS. Our Tribes assemblies have focused on our Positive Climates for Learning initiatives (including Black History Month, Wellness and Environmental Stewardship) and our Light It Up Blue Assembly was an incredible celebration of learning for all. As a school community, we raised over \$600for Autism Ontario.

As we get closer to the end of the school year, there are many goals still to be accomplished. Students will spend the next two months completing the curriculum for their grade engaging in many rich learning opportunities. Grade 3 and 6 students will be participating in the EQAO assessment of reading, writing and mathematics from May 25—June 8.

We are excited to host our second 'Fun Fair' at Pierre Berton on June 9th, 5:00 pm—8:00 pm. The School Council has been meeting regularly to plan the event. If you would like to volunteer with the Fun Fair, please contact the school office. We plan to have another basket raffle at the Fun Fair. Information will be sent home shortly. We are looking forward to coming together as a school community to celebrate another successful school year.




If your child was born in 2012 and you have not yet registered your child for Junior Kindergarten, please visit our office to complete the registration package at your earliest convenience.

Healthy Schools Recipe of the Month

Turkey Burgers

After a long day at work, it's so easy to pick up some dinner at a fast food restaurant. When you're tempted to do that, try this recipe for healthy burgers instead.

Ingredients:

- 1 sweet onion, chopped
- 8 sundried tomatoes, sliced into slivers
- 5-7 cremini mushrooms, chopped
- 1 clove of fresh garlic, chopped
- 2 tbsp fresh chives, chopped
- 2 tsp hot chilli flakes
- 1 egg or 1 tbsp chia seeds soaked in 4 tbsp water till they turn pudding-like
- 1 tbsp wheat-free organic tamari sauce
- ½ kilo ground lean (choose organic) turkey

Method:

Preheat your grill to medium or your oven to 350F. Chop all of the vegetables and set them aside. Place the ground turkey in a large bowl. Whisk the egg and combine the egg and tamari with the turkey. Add all the vegetables and spices and mix everything together with your hands. Form into patties.

This recipe makes four to six burgers depending on how large you make them.

Cook on the grill for 10 to 12 minutes to cook completely. If you're baking them, bake for seven to nine minutes on one side then flip them over and cook for another seven to nine minutes.
