# Kindergarten Registration to Commence January 19th, 2018

Kindergarten registration will commence on January 19, 2018 for the 2018-19 school year. Registration forms are available on YRDSB's website: www.yrdsb.ca. Children who turn four or five years old during 2018, live within the school boundary and whose parents are public school tax supporters will be eligible to register for kindergarten. A kindergarten information session for parents is being planned for this spring. For more information please visit the YRDSB website or contact your local school.



# **French Immersion Information Sessions and Registrations**

Information sessions for the French Immersion (FI) program will take place at French Immersion schools on January 18, 2018 at 7 p.m. Please visit YRDSB's website in January 2018 (http://www.yrdsb.ca/Programs/fi/Pages/ Program-Locations.aspx) to find the FI program location for your elementary school location. FI registration will begin January 19, 2018. Parents or guardians of Senior Kindergarten students entering Grade 1 in 2018, and wishing to enrol in the FI Program, can visit or call the school office and request an Office Index Card - short version. The Office Index Card must be signed by the principal of the home school. Parents or guardians then take this form, along with one piece of identification showing their address to the designated FI program location to register between January 19 and February 9, 2018. This eliminates the need to provide duplicate enrollment information or to pre-register.

YRDSB's FI Accommodation Plan provides long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol. The FI program will be offered in Dual Track or Single Track settings, in a variety of configurations. In order to meet community needs and optimize available space in our schools, a community's Grade 1-8 FI program may be provided over more than one school during the course of a student's FI education. Space requirements at some schools may mean that siblings are in different schools for primary dual track French Immersion programs due to differing grade structures. Like any of our schools across the Board, changes to school boundaries, and/or the accommodation model for the French Immersion program may need to be considered when new schools open, a school experiences enrolment growth, and program changes occur. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools.

More information is available on the Board's website: www.yrdsb.ca. Please note: Some of the FI accommodation plans will require facility modifications or the development of new schools and will require short-term transition plans that might include overflow while we work toward the long-term vision. Overflow refers to situations in which the Board directs students to attend a school other than their community school or optional program for a specific period of time, as defined in Policy #108.

# **School Bus Cancellation Notice**

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled from due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast. Please note the following:

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be **region-wide** meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.
- Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

# PBPS CARIBOU MATH CONTEST RESULT

Forty-four Pierre Berton students participated in the year's first Caribou Math Contest last month to resounding success!

In the Grade 3/4 contest, our highest rank was 15<sup>th</sup> overall in our board, 157<sup>th</sup> overall in our province, 202<sup>th</sup> overall in our country and an incredible 224<sup>th</sup> overall in the world. That's 224<sup>th</sup> best score out of 5820 contestant in

the whole world! That is an amazing top 4% rank in the whole world!

In the grade 5/6 contest, our highest rank was 63<sup>rd</sup> overall in our board, 703<sup>rd</sup> overall in our province, 840<sup>th</sup> overall in our country and an amazing 911<sup>th</sup> overall in the world. That's 911<sup>th</sup> best score out of 8377 contestant in the whole world!!! That's as an incredible top 11% rank in the whole world.

In the grade 7/8 contest, our highest rank was 33<sup>rd</sup> overall in our board, 533<sup>rd</sup> overall in our province, 625<sup>th</sup> overall in our country and an amazing 670<sup>th</sup> overall in the world. That's 670<sup>th</sup> best score out of 8799 contestant in the whole world! We also had another high score of 741<sup>st</sup> out of 8799 globally in this group. That means that we had two people who ranked in the top 9% in the entire world. That is simply Pantherific!!!

We are so pleased that our students have been working so hard in math and are demonstrating their knowledge so successfully. We are proud of all of the students that participated in the caribou contest and we look forward to their participation in January.

The contest is open all year to all PBPS students from grades 3 to 8, please encourage your child to come out in January.

# PBPS MATH NIGHT Thursday, December 7th, 2017





# The Power of Positive Thinking

Positivity is a hot topic right now. We hear a lot about "being positive" and "random acts of kindness", but what is it really and why should we buy into this way of thinking? The power of positive thinking is just that – powerful! Many studies from Harvard to the Huffington Post have shown that if you change the way you think to a more positive way of thinking character traits such as perseverance and confidence increase as well. This month Mrs. Samra's class and Mrs. Ridgley's class have teamed up to give PBPS a challenge of being more positive. Simple acts such as smiling at one another and saying thank you to more complicated actions like changing your thinking will result in more successful and happy people.

We challenge you to participate at home as well. You can do this with simple acts of kindness such as:

- 1. Giving a hug to family member for at least 6 seconds.
- 2. Smiling more often.
- 3. Saying thank you more often (to yourself and others).
- 4. Leaving a motivational post-it on the bathroom mirror for yourself or a family member.
- 5. Telling family members how great they are and why.
- 6. Going outdoors and taking a moment to list the things you are thankful for, or
- 7. Making others smile by doing something as simple as telling a joke. Try this one:

Knock, knock. OR What happens to a frog's OR Knock, knock!
Who's there? car when it breaks down? Who's there?
Tank. It gets toad away. Watson
Tank who? Watson TV tonight?

So this month, look for the positivity shields around the school and check out team 209's mural in the front hall-way to help train your brain to think more positive. For example, instead of saying, "I can't believe I made a mistake" try thinking "mistakes help me learn." Or "I'm just not good at this" try thinking "I will keep trying and I will get better".

### **Dental Health**

Recently, many of our students received dental screening from the York Region Public Health. Dental health is a very important aspect of your child's overall health and we encourage everyone to ensure that dental care is a regular part your child's daily routine.

A dental screening is a quick inspection of a child's mouth by a registered dental hygienist. York
Region Public Health offers dental screening in elementary schools, by appointment at one of York Region's Public Health dental clinics, or by request at some Ontario Early Years Centres.

A dental screening will help find dental problems so children can receive the right treatment. It can also be the first step to receiving assistance for urgent dental problems through the *Healthy Smiles Ontario (HSO)* program, or receiving preventive dental care at one of York Region's Public Health dental clinics. 
