# Noteworthy Information

## Bus Loop / Fire Route



We continue to experience difficulty with keeping our bus loop / fire route free of vehicles during the school day, especially at lunch. **The loop at the front of the school is not for parent/guardian/visitor use at any time of the day.** The loop is restricted to school transportation and emergency vehicles. We respectfully ask parents to stop parking/stopping in this area. At all times of the day, please use the parking lot at the side of the school. If you are coming into the school, there are usually several vacant parking spots available in the parking lot. We need to all work together to keep our students safe. We have added additional 'Buses Only' signs at the entrance to communicate this message. In addition, we have pylons out to indicate that this is not an area for vehicles to enter. Please note that at times the pylons are moved to the side to enable buses to enter for lunchtime pick up. Please note that the movement of these pylons **does not** indicate that vehicles can enter the loop.

## Kiss & Ride

The Kiss and Ride in the morning is working very well. We appreciate parents moving their vehicles right to the top of the loop prior to dropping off the children. This allows more vehicles to stop at one time, thus alleviating the traffic congestion. As the weather begins to get colder, we know that more students will be driven to school. Please ensure that you leave earlier in the morning as the most challenging time is the last minute rush at the bell. If all families make a strong effort to arrive at 8:15am –8:20 am, we will avoid the last minute congestion and, most importantly, the students will arrive on time for school. Students arriving late continues to be a problem and it is important that we model responsibility for students which includes punctuality.

## Bully Prevention Measures

The York Region District School Board (YRDSB) has launched a new web reporting tool that allows students, parents and community members to report bullying incidents as well as positive behaviours and events related to our students and learning environments. The online tool, called **Report It!**, is a web button on the YRSB homepage ([www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca](http://www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca)) that links to an online form where users report bullying or positive behaviours that are consistent with Character Matters.

The development of this tool is the result of student feedback from an anti-bullying conference held last spring. It is meant for reporting **non-emergencies only** and deals solely with **student** issues. Follow-up will be determined by the severity of the incident and may involve sharing information with authorities. Users may submit reports anonymously (although anonymity cannot be absolutely guaranteed).

YRDSB is also asking students, parents, teachers and community members to "Take the Pledge" against bullying. To learn more, click on "The Pledge" image on the YRDSB website or go to [www.ctvbarrie.ca](http://www.ctvbarrie.ca).

## French Immersion Registration

YRDSB recently completed a year-long review of the French as a Second Language (FSL) programs, including Core French and French Immersion (FI). One of the outcomes of this review was a toolkit to address the need for French immersion spaces and allow the Planning department to craft a long-term FI accommodation plan for students across York Region. YRDSB's FI program will be offered in a variety of settings: Dual Track (Grades 1-8), Primary Dual Track (Grades 1-2 or 1-3) and Single Track (Grades 1-8, 2-8, or 3-8). Students may begin the French Immersion program in one location, but continue in a different location. This will allow flexibility in addressing community needs and the opportunity to use existing space in schools. The new accommodation plan will provide long-term consistency and equity of access to all students in York Region and will enable YRDSB to continue to offer the FI program to all who wish to enrol.

Information sessions for the FI program will take place at Elder's Mills Public School on January 23, 2013 at 7 p.m. and registration will take place Feb. 1 – 15, 2013.

# Digital Literacy

## Digital Literacy at PBPS!

*Literacy in the 21st Century is the acquisition of knowledge, skills and attitudes that enable achievement, personal well-being and full participation in an interconnected and changing world community. –YRDSB, 2010.*

### What is Digital Literacy?

The York Region District School Board recognizes a need to achieve a cultural shift in how we understand literacy and in how we engage learners in order to increase student achievement and engagement. Pierre Berton P.S. students and teachers approach learning through the use of educational tools that can help them experience engaging, authentic learning and demonstrate their understanding. This approach prepares our students to be literate and successful in a digital, globally connected, and changing world. Through this approach we are all expanding our understanding of literacy, learning, knowledge, and skills. The process of integrating literacy and technology is referred to as 'digital literacy'.

### What is Critical Thinking?

Critical thinking is critical or evaluative thinking. It is a complex activity, not a set of generic skills. Concerned with judging or assessing what is reasonable or sensible in a situation, Focuses on quality of reasoning, Depends on the possession of relevant knowledge Can be done in endless contexts and is required whenever the situation is problematic Is effortful but not necessarily negative

## Specialist High Skills Major Programs

**Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) programs** are rapidly expanding throughout the York Region District School Board. We now have 28 of 31 secondary schools offering these valuable programs and next year, we hope to see 30 of 31 schools running one or more SHSM programs. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) allows students to specialize in a specific economic sector (e.g. Health and Wellness, Business, Manufacturing, Arts & Culture, etc) while fulfilling all requirements for their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). 100% of students in SHSM programs have had an enhanced educational experience with contextualized learning, and additional experiential learning to enable them to make more informed post-secondary destination decisions. Grade 7 & 8 students and their families are encouraged to browse through the SHSM literature to investigate some programs that may be of interest to them.

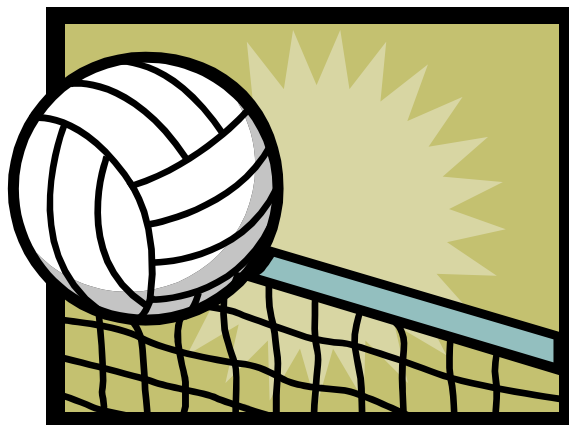

## STS School Vehicle Cancellation Procedure

School bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Since some busing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m. or earlier, all cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to ensure the safety of our students. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with school bus companies servicing York Region. Decisions are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature and road conditions.

Please note the following:

- A decision to cancel school bus transportation may be system wide (where all buses in York Region are cancelled) or municipality specific (where buses in one or more municipalities are cancelled).
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is cancelled and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is operational, your child will not be transported to/from school.
- If school bus transportation in your municipality is operational and your child attends school in a different municipality where service is cancelled, your child will not be transported to/from school.
- If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.
