Students who will be absent for an extended length of time in September are required by the Ministry of Education Bill 52 to complete a form indicating the date of their expected return. Please drop by the office if you require a form.

Student Bussing Eligibility

Did you know that students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.


News from the Learning Commons ...

Last Day of School—Early Dismissal

All schools in the York Region District School Board are committed to student success and well-being. On **Thursday, June 27th, 2013** an early release day will take place to allow elementary teachers and support staff to take part in staff meetings during the afternoon of that day. These meetings will allow for school staff to engage in culminating activities regarding the review and revision of the School's Improvement Plan.

As has been our practice over the past three years, students will attend school during the morning of Thursday, June 27th, 2013 only. Students will be dismissed early that day at **11:30 a.m.**. Arrangements will be made to ensure that students who are normally bussed to and from school will receive transportation at this time. Parents whose children attend after school child care should make appropriate arrangements to address this change in schedule.
