Edsby is a great tool to engage our school community. Edsby can be used to:

- 1. Enhance School Communication using Calendar and News
- 2. Book Teacher/Parent Interviews
- 3. Share important communications with families
- 4. Collaborate using groups
- 5. Be the online hub for extracurricular teams and clubs

As a school we will continue to implement Edsby as a communication tool. In December, we will transition to use the "River of News" instead of a monthly school newsletter. More information about our "River of News" will be sent home closer to December.

What does it mean when a parent has access to Edsby?

Parents will be able to access:

- School News and Events through the Calendar and River of News
- Homework and Classroom as determined by teachers
- Scheduling Parent Teacher interviews
- Anytime, anywhere access to student and school information across devices

Parents will also be able to report absences and view their child's attendance.

Tips to Stop Cyberbullying

WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

1. Keep the computer in a common area of the home. Do not allow it in your children's bedrooms. Monitor their online usage.

2. Learn how various social networking websites work. Become familiar with Facebook, MySpace, and Twitter. Ask your children if they will show you their profile pages.

3. Talk regularly and specifically with your children about online issues. Let them know they can come to you for help if anything is inappropriate, upsetting, or dangerous.

4. Build trust with your children. Set time limits, explain your reasons for them, and discuss rules for online safety and Internet use. Ask your children to contribute to establishing the rules; then they'll be more inclined to follow them.

5. Tell your children not to respond to any cyberbullying threats or comments online. However, do not delete any of the messages. Instead, print out all the messages, including the e-mail addresses or online screen names of the cyberbully. You will need the messages to verify and prove there is cyberbullying.

6. Don't overreact by blaming your children. If they are being bullied, be supportive and understanding. Find out how long the <u>bullying</u> has been going on and ensure that you'll work together to find a solution. Let your children know they are not to blame for being bullied.

7. Don't underreact by telling your children to "shrug it off" or just deal with the bullying. The emotional pain of being bullied is very real and can have long-lasting effects. Don't tease them about it or respond with a "kids will be kids" attitude.

8. Don't threaten to take away your children's computers if they come to you with a problem. This only forces kids to be more secretive.

9. Talk to your child's teacher so they can keep an eye out for bullying during the school day.

10. If there are threats of physical violence or the bullying continues to escalate, get law enforcement involved.

WHAT CAN KIDS DO?

1. Don't respond to any online or text messages sent by cyberbullies.

2. Don't be an accomplice by forwarding any of the messages to others kids.

3. Save and print out all the messages as proof and evidence of cyberbullying.

4. If you are being bullied, tell an adult immediately to get help solving the problem.

A Message from The Yoga Project:

The Yoga Project school programs are based on the belief and knowledge that yoga has a profound effect on children, youth, teens and families. Yoga teaches us self-awareness and helps to develop inner strength, personal insight, and the ability to move through life from a place of connectedness. Equipping students with the tools to know and recognize how to calm or energize oneself, when to ease up or get centred, how to self-regulate and build confidence, are all skills for life that we strive to empower in today's youth.

What you can expect in The Yoga Project classes:

Mindfulness: We aim to teach students how to connect with themselves, so that they are able to make connections to others and the world around them.

Physical Literacy: Students safely perform movement sequences, yoga poses and balancing postures. **Breath Work:** Students learn about breath awareness through practical applications that promote self-regulation, emotional balance and holistic wellness.

Focus Activities: These are used to heighten present-moment awareness, concentration and clarity. **Partner/Group Work:** Touch is transformative. Learning to work together cultivates communication and aids in the development of confidence, trust + empathy.

Relaxation/Visualization: This may include, but is not limited to: guided imagery/story, tools to de-stress, and present-awareness activities.
